- May 23: Drop/Add ends

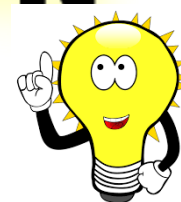

2. COMPLETE ALL 7 STEPS OF YOUR MCHS REGISTRATION FORM CORRECTLY! REGISTRATION FORMS ARE ON PAPER AND WILL BE PROVIDED TO YOU BY YOUR 1ST PERIOD TEACHER ON FEBRUARY 4TH.

- STEP 1 - CORE ACADEMIC CLASSES - circle your 4 CORE choices
- STEP 2 - CHECK OFF SPECIALTY PROGRAMS, IF APPLICABLE
- STEP 3 - CIRCLE 2 ELECTIVE CLASSES
- STEP 4 - LIST 3 ALTERNATE ELECTIVE CLASSES *****THIS IS IMPORTANT***** MOST MISSED STEP IN THE REGISTRATION PROCESS
- STEP 5 - STUDENT INITIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT ABOUT REGISTRATION, COMPLETE THE [AP CONTRACT](#) and/ or [PARENT OVERRIDE FORM](#), IF APPLICABLE
- STEP 6 - PARENT/GUARDIAN SIGNATURE
- STEP 7 - TURN IN YOUR REGISTRATION FORM TO YOUR 1ST PERIOD TEACHER

ALL STUDENTS MUST: (EVEN IF YOU ARE GOING TO DO DUAL ENROLLMENT/MAXWELL/GRAYSON TECH/ETC.):

- CIRCLE 6 TOTAL CLASSES (these are the classes you WANT)
- WRITE IN 3 ALTERNATE ELECTIVE CLASSES: (these are your backup electives)
- ⇒ **Why do you need alternates?** Alternates are used if/when we are not able to give you an elective class you circled.

Registration Tips *(continued)*

3. READ ELECTIVE CLASS REQUIREMENTS AND DESCRIPTIONS CAREFULLY. MAKE SURE YOU UNDERSTAND THE EXPECTATIONS AND PREREQUISITES

The MCHS Core & Elective Course offerings and the AP Course offerings documents provide TONS of information about MCHS class options. Please do not register for a class if you do not have the required prerequisite. If you try to register for a class that you are not eligible to take we will not register you for the class and we will enter another class for you.

If you are interested in taking a Mill Creek Online class, the website provides specific information, teacher contact, application, and a FAQ. MCHS seniors and juniors will receive priority for these classes. Make sure you complete the application and return it to Ms. Wilder, Room B115. Make sure to circle the MCHS online class as one of your six choices. *Please note that Mill Creek Online classes will be assigned a "placeholder" by the curriculum office for registration purposes, which will be viewable in April.

4. KNOW WHAT ELECTIVE COURSES YOU WANT TO REGISTER FOR BEFORE FEBRUARY 4TH.

The [MCHS Core & Elective Course Offerings](#) provides all the information you need to make a decision about which elective classes you want to take next year. Some elective classes require auditions or applications and you should begin this process ASAP. There are also elective classes that have required prerequisites and you need to be aware of those before you actually register for classes. We try our best to register you for the elective classes that you want to take so please read through the class information carefully.

5. UNDERSTAND THAT IF YOU REGISTER FOR AN AP COURSE (EVEN IF IT IS A TEACHER RECOMMENDED AP CLASS) YOU UNDERSTAND THE EXPECTATIONS AND YOU STAPLE AN AP CONTRACT TO THE BACK OF YOUR REGISTRATION FORM.

If you CIRCLE or choose an ALTERNATE class that is an AP class you must staple a signed [MCHS AP contract](#) to the BACK of your registration form. You will NOT be enrolled in an AP class without an AP contract. Remember: many AP courses have summer assignments.

6. GIVE TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS SERIOUS CONSIDERATION.

If you decide against following your teacher's recommendation (whether you wish to move up a level or down a level than what is recommended) make sure it is the right decision. In order to override a teacher recommendation, you must **STAPLE** a completed [MCHS Parent Override Form](#) to the BACK of your registration form.

7. MAKE CLASS CHOICES CAREFULLY

We try our best to assign classes based on what you CIRCLE on your registration form, so be purposeful in your choices. If you do not circle 6 classes AND write in 3 alternate elective classes the Mill Creek Curriculum office will choose classes for you. You will be able to view your classes on April 18th and change any classes from April 18th - May 23rd.

Drop/Add

What is Drop/Add?

This is an opportunity, beginning April 18th, for students to view the classes they have been registered to take next year in StudentVue for 2025-2026. This list of classes does not mean we were able to schedule these classes, but we will be in contact with students who have scheduling conflicts. IF everything on the Course Requests document is CORRECT, then a student does not have to do anything.

IF anything on the Course Request document is NOT correct or a student needs to make a CHANGE, then the student will complete a Drop/Add Request - this will be a link available through the Mill Creek website on April 18th.

A drop/add request can be completed for any student who wants:

- A different level class than what the teacher recommended (or what they registered for in February)
- A different class than what is on the list



WHAT IS A PAIRED COURSE?

Paired Courses are two courses that students take at the same time in one class period. They are deliberately paired based on a high level of intersecting content, skills, and objectives.

HOW MANY CREDITS DO THEY EARN?

You will be scheduled for 2 courses, therefore you can potentially earn 2 CTAE course credits. Assignments require a high level of connection and understanding between the two courses; therefore students will earn grades for both.

*The only exception to earning two credits is if you have already taken one of the two courses in a paired offering.

4TH YEAR SCIENCE! THIS COURSE IS DESIGNED TO BE EQUIVALENT TO A FIRST-SEMESTER INTRODUCTORY COLLEGE COMPUTING COURSE. STUDENTS WILL DEVELOP COMPUTATIONAL THINKING SKILLS, ANALYZE AND STUDY DATA, AND WORK WITH LARGE DATA SETS TO ANALYZE, VISUALIZE, AND DRAW CONCLUSIONS FROM TRENDS. STUDENTS WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE THE AP COMPUTER SCIENCE PRINCIPLES EXAM TO SEEK COLLEGE CREDIT, COLLEGE PLACEMENT, OR BOTH.

PREREQUISITE: SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF ENHANCED ALGEBRA/ALGEBRA I WITH A STRONG FOUNDATION OF MATHEMATICAL REASONING IS REQUIRED. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT STUDENTS HAVE TAKEN OR BE RECOMMENDED FOR GEOMETRY OR ACCELERATED GEOMETRY.

STUDENTS WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THIS COURSE CAN TAKE AP COMPUTER SCIENCE A TO COMPLETE THE PATHWAY.

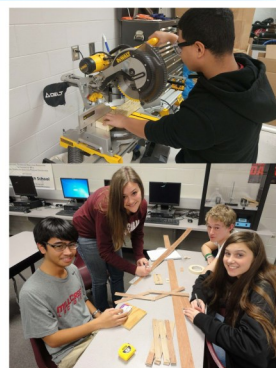

Intro Course in Sports Medicine Pathway


The course allows students to receive initial exposure to Healthcare Science skills and attitudes applicable to the healthcare industry.
