Program Plan Intent:

Mission Statement: The Mission of the Board, administration, and staff of Hutto ISD is to achieve excellence in academics, character and community through strong academic programs and overall school activities that involve our parents, community, and all members of the Hutto ISD staff.

Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) provides federal funding for schools with a high percentage of students who qualify for the free/reduced lunch program. Title I, Part A funds are used to ensure that all students meet the state's high academic standards.

Ten campuses within Hutto ISD receive Title I, Part A funding.

Definition: Section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Parental and family engagement means the participation of parents and family members in regular, two—way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring (A) that parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning; (B) that parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education on and off campus; (C) that parents are full partners in their child's education and are included as meaningful partners in decision making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

All students will be expected to work toward mastering the curriculum objectives outlined in the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). Our district recognizes the fact that some students will need additional assistance to achieve their full potential. The extra assistance is available to all students at the Title 1 schools through Title I supplemental programs and various other educational services offered through the district. Hutto ISD intends to include parents in all aspects of the Title 1 program.

Hutto ISD is dedicated to maintaining the highest standards of excellence to provide students with the tools needed to become confident leaders and achieve their goals. We commit to not only welcome families but to embrace their contributions to the success of our schools and the well-being of our students. We take on the responsibility to hire and retain dedicated, exceptional staff to promote a model learning environment.

As a district, we have adopted the tagline: Innovating Today, Shaping Tomorrow. A reminder that maintaining a forward-thinking mindset and embracing innovation in our practices today will lay the foundation for a brighter, more successful future for our students and community.

Expectations and Objectives

Parent and Family Engagement(PFE) Program Expectations:

- Coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies with programs such as Pre-K and Head Start programs to better prepare students for school.
- Provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with children with limited English proficiency, parents of children with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.
- Offer language assistance through staff, translation devices, and translatable document and communication formats.
- Led by the Director of Federal, State, and Special Programs, employ Parent Engagement team
 members to obtain, manage, and distribute resources for families, provide training, ensure adherence
 to required practices and policies, support campuses and the district, connect with the community
 and business leaders, orchestrate and participate in curriculum-enhancing, enriching, and assistance
 events, and address needs of families.
- Provide a Parent Resource Center that offers a wide range of support, including access to resources, brochures, training materials, reference books, and our Parent and Community Resource Library.
 The center also provides computer and internet access, as well as meeting facilities for community use.

- Maintain a Parent and Family Engagement website and social media page to notify parents of upcoming events and motivate them to take part in and increase attendance.
- Monitor and respond in a timely manner to Parent and Family Engagement electronic communication through a dedicated team email address: pfe@huttoisd.net
- Organize and promote a successful volunteer program to include:
 - Appropriate safety measures through a formal application, training, background check and volunteer check-in upon arrival at each assigned volunteer location, a volunteer badge, and campus-provided procedural rules.
 - 2. Opportunities to be a volunteer at all major events, through our website, in each campus front office and main district office, and at each Parent Resource Center.
 - 3. Recognizing our volunteers through Volunteer of the Month, Family of the Month, and during National Volunteer Appreciation Week events.
