The Department

French and Spanish are core subjects in the Prep School. In the Senior School, both subjects are core in the Fourth Form, and optional at GCSE. We therefore have healthy numbers studying one or both subjects to GCSE and A level (AQA specifications), with strong external results. The department is vibrant and forward-thinking, and believes in languages for all, regardless of background or ability. Language trips are run to locations such as Paris, The Loire Valley, Tenerife and Barcelona.

The supportive department values individual strengths and collaboration. The successful candidate will work closely with the Head of Spanish, and other MFL teachers. In addition to being a fine classroom practitioner, they will take part in tracking processes to ensure each pupil develops according to their own targets and wider academic expectations.

All classrooms have interactive white boards or screens, with full wireless internet access for all pupils. All pupils have laptops and blended learning using various digital media is a strong feature of what we do. Culford uses iSAMS and the Google Suite of Applications, including Google Classroom, Google Meet, Google Drive and Google Sheets and a range of educationally-approved Al platforms such as Magic School. Whilst experience in the use of these products would be advantageous, full training will be given as necessary to the successful candidate. The department has a generous budget and provides all necessary resources. Teachers wishing for specific resources are encouraged to apply for them to develop our educational offer further.

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From September 2025, academic lessons will be taught from Monday to Friday allowing time on Saturday mornings for our ACE Programme (Academic and Co-Curricular Enrichment). In the life of our busy boarding school, teachers are currently expecting to deliver enrichment activities on approximately 50% of Saturdays.

Culford believes in professional and personal development and will seek to support the successful candidate in all areas. We have connections with the Teachers' Development Trust and the Chartered College of Teaching, and seek to offer a wide range of professional development opportunities to all staff. We aim to ensure that our pupils are receiving the best possible experience in the classroom, while our staff are supported in developing their careers.

Teaching and learning at Culford received high praise in our last ISI inspection (May 2023). We value dynamism and risk-taking, and colleagues are given freedom to teach creatively in ways that inspire pupils.

Lead and manage the French department, and collaboratively work with other members of the Modern Foreign Languages department

- Teach pupils of a range of ability, from Fourth Form (Year 9) to A Level
- Ideally be able to teach Spanish to Fourth Form (Year 9) level, but this is not essential
- Care for a tutor group of around 12 pupils
