Final Touch Barber Academy



Boatbuilding Update



Cadets in the Boatbuilding Program finished their introduction to Shop procedures and saftey by building a toolbox. After a lesson in bouyancy and displacement, Cadets began work on their boat! This year's build is a traditional Delaware river design, a Harbormaster 14'. First-year builders are laying out and building the hull while the returning advanced crew are building the sailing gear. Once completed Cadets will be able to sail or row their craft.

Starting the second week of January, Cadets started cutting out the stem and planks, and laying out the transom.











SeaPerch and Seaglide



Cadets started building their Seaglide and Seaperch entries for 2025! Mr. Wallis introduced Cadets to Seaglide, a programmable autonomous underwater vehicle. Cadets practiced soldering and began programming their robot. Seapearch is a tethered underwater vehicle with specific mission requirements. Mr. Gosse works with Cadets to design and build the Seaperch device, document the design-build process, and present a real-world application poster.



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













