Student Engagement Seal

Students will meet the requirement of the Student Engagement Seal by participating in extracurricular activities as determined by the guidelines set by the Franklin Monroe School Board.

Criteria:

Participation in at least one student group, extracurricular, or sport for a minimum of 3 school years such as, but not limited to: athletics, clubs, student government to a meaningful extent:

- Extracurricular activities include clubs, sports, and leadership groups for which the student does NOT earn academic credit
- Active participation is described as a minimum of 80%, active involvement, as well as the completion of the activity's duration (an entire school year for many)
- Students who are ineligible due to discipline or academic issues cannot count that season/year towards this seal.
