
## **Liberty-Curtin Annual Title I Meeting**

## **Agenda**

Purpose: The purpose of today's meeting is to review the 2024-2025 Title I Federal Program Monitoring Requirements with families and to receive family input into all aspects of our program.

## 1. Title I Program

  - ii. Be notified if your child is taught for more than 4 consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified (posted to our Class Dojo, to our <u>Liberty-Curtin Monthly Newsletter</u> and to our <u>webpage</u>.)
    - 1. As of August 31, 2024, zero staff in the elementary buildings are teaching outside of their certification area.
    - 2. <u>Sample Right to Know Letter for 2024-2025</u>-dated for 8/26/2024 as per federal requirements, just in case we have to hire someone with an emergency certification in the elementary schools.
  - iii. Request opportunities for regular meetings with staff in order to make suggestions
  - iv. Participate in decisions relating to the education of your child
  - v. Submit a written comment on the <u>Title I Schoolwide Program Plan</u> if you are not satisfied with the plan
