Dear Parents and Guardians:

The month of February is cold. During this time our students tend to stay inside more and technology use increases. Here are a few things to consider when discussing appropriate technology use with your child:

- 1. **Create scree-free times and zones**. Help kids take breaks from tech by limiting screen time in bedrooms, during study time, or at the dinner table.
- 2. **Try parental controls**. Set content limits that makes sense for your family. Alongside conversations about healthy media habits, use features such as content filtering, privacy settings, and time limits offered by the apps and platforms your family uses to help manage access and exposure to media.
- 3. Establish clear family rules. Decide together what kind of media and tech is OK and when it's OK to use it. A family media plan can help get everyone on the same page.
