DEVELOPING FEMALE LEADERS, INNOVATORS, CHANGEMAKERS

OVERVIEW

The Pathways Program at Mercy High School nurtures students' passions and career interests by providing opportunities and experiences both within and beyond the classroom. Students are guided and supported through a four-year process of exploration and achievement in their chosen field.

Curriculum	Pathways students are required to complete curricular work relevant to their Pathway. This work will include:			
	 Two courses at Mercy that directly relate to the Pathway (see next page) 			
	 Assignments in other Mercy courses that are relevant to a student's Pathway (such as choosing a relevant topic for a project or paper) 			
	 Classes outside of Mercy, such as online courses, community college courses, or other local classes 			
	 Clubs and activities at Mercy that relate to the Pathway 			
Experiences	Pathways Moderators will provide students with information about upcoming opportunities for experiences outside of Mercy, though students are also welcome to seek out their own experiences. Students should attend at least four experiences per year. These may include:			
	 Field trips organized by Pathways Moderators Conferences Workshops Museums Internships Community events Camps Virtual events Performances Tours Service 			
Speakers	Pathways Moderators will bring in at least two speakers per semester to speak to the students in that Pathway. Speakers will be professionals in the field or people with education and/or experience in the field. Students are also welcome to seek out other speaker events to attend.			
Projects	In addition to completing coursework relevant to their Pathway, students are encouraged to work on personal projects outside of school. These may be part of such experiences as a camp, internship, workshop, volunteer service, or online class, or they can be entirely self-directed.			
Capstone	During a student's senior year, she will choose a topic to focus on and create a Capstone Project on that topic. The topic must be approved by the Pathway Moderator and Pathways Director.			

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CURRICULUM

Students are required to take two* of the courses listed for their Pathway and are encouraged to prioritize other courses relevant to their Pathway when choosing electives, Honors, and AP courses.

To fulfill the curriculum requirement, students must also choose topics related to their Pathway for projects and papers in other classes (whenever possible and subject to approval by the Pathway Moderator). Students are further encouraged to participate in Mercy Activities that are relevant to their Pathway.
