What is it?	At Cameron Dual Language Elementary we recognize that our leaders of tomorrow must possess many skills to be successful. Our citizens must be innovative problem solvers, self-reliant, and literate. In addition, we recognize the need for us all to have a mutual understanding and respect for one another and our differences. We at Cameron pledge to instill in our students these skills and qualities. The goal of Cameron Dual Language Magnet Elementary to promote a school-home-community partnership that will help all students in the school succeed. The administrators, teachers, and staff believe that parents are partners in the education of their children and that parent involvement and empowerment are essential at all levels throughout the school career of all students. Communication of Policy	Cameron Dual Language Magnet Elementary School will involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely way in the planning, review, and improvement of programs offered through Title I. This policy will be distributed to parents, in English and Spanish, at the beginning of the year and during the Annual Title I meeting. In addition, this policy will be posted on Cameron's webpage in English and Spanish. This policy will be revised during the annual evaluation held at the end of the school year. Parents will jointly conduct an evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent engagement policy and revise as necessary. Parents will receive the annual evaluation survey in the Spring. Parents will have the opportunity to review the parent engagement policy and the school parent compact and submit their recommendations.
Family Meetings	Annually, two meetings will be held at a convenient time, to which all parents will be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of the school's participation in the Title I program, explain the requirements of Title I program, and the right of parents to be involved. These meetings will be held in the Fall. Parents will be notified via email and notes sent home with students, in English and Spanish. During these meetings, parents will receive a copy of the parent engagement policy and the school parent compact, in English and Spanish.
How to be involved	Parents will be provided with opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions, share experiences with other parents, and to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children. The school will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as morning and evening, and may provide, with funds provided Title 1, transportation, child care, or home visits, as such services relate to parental engagement. These meetings will be held in the Fall and Spring semesters.
Family Trainings/Activities	Parents will be provided timely information about available programs through Cameron's webpage, email and text message notification, letters sent home with students, and phone messages. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents will be provided with the school performance profiles and assistance with interpreting their child's individual assessment results. • Parents will be aided in understanding such topics as the challenging State academic standards, State and local academic assessments, how to monitor a child's progress, and how to work with educators to improve the achievement of their children. This assistance will be provided through parent-teacher conferences and through the student data folders. • Parents will be provided a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficient levels students are expected to meet. This assistance will be provided through parent-teacher conferences and through the student data folders. • Parents will be notified of the materials and training to help them work with their children to improve their children's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology.
Curriculum	Cameron is a Dual Language Two-Way Immersion program where all students are second language learners. The school's curriculum includes ECISD approved resources for Reading, Writing, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
Forms of Academic	Forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress: MAP testing, Short Cycle Assessments, Istation, iReady, and STAAR.

Assessment	Teachers are required to communicate student achievement levels.
