Students in 3th 5th are tested in Science and all EB students test in their both English and Spanish. Students in 3th 5th grades complete the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, or STAAR test. The STAAR test measures student achievement in grades 3th 5th and measures student progress in reading and math for 4th and 5th grades. Bilingual students in K-5th grades are also evaluated in their language proficiency through the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS). In addition, every teacher in K-5th grades administers the district's Short Cycle formative assessments at the end of each unit.
