



Tech Fees Summary

- Beginning academic year 2025-2026, there will no longer be ANY required lab fees for iPads OR MacBooks.
- **iPad Fees:**
 - The district purchases cases with a 4-year warranty for damage to the device to reduce repair costs.
 - Any iPad repair will incur a \$25 processing/repair fee.
 - Lost or stolen iPads are NOT covered under warranty. Unrepairable iPads are also NOT covered under warranty.
- **MacBook Fees:**
 - Optional annual non-refundable \$45 fee will count as credit toward the buyout.
 - Families have the option to purchase a warranty from 1-4 years to cover any MacBook repair costs.
 - Lost or stolen MacBooks are NOT covered under warranty. Unrepairable MacBooks are also NOT covered.

TECH FEES FOR 1:1 DEVICES 2025-2026

iPads

LLS will be eliminating ALL Tech lab fees for 2025-2026 and going forward. LLS purchases a protective case that carries a 4-year warranty for any damages to iPads. If an iPad is broken beyond repair or lost, it's not covered under warranty and the student will be responsible for the full cost to replace the iPad. If the iPad is stolen, the student may provide a police report to prove theft. Once the police report is filed with LLS, there will be no fee for replacement.

The only repair cost the district charges for an iPad is a standard \$25 processing/repair fee, whether or not the device is still under district warranty.

MacBooks

The MacBook *optional* \$45 annual and *non-refundable* fee will count as credit towards the buyout of the MacBook upon graduation. For example, If a student paid the \$45 installment each year for 4 yrs and the buyout cost for the MacBook is \$400, you can deduct \$180 (\$45x4) off the buyout cost, so they would pay \$220. Prior years with the mandatory \$45 lab fee will also count as credit towards the MacBook buyout.

Insurance for MacBooks is optional. Repairable damage is covered, but the student will pay the FULL repair cost if not insured. An example of a common repair is for screen damage, which now costs \$220 to repair.
