Forms of Academic Assessments	Blanton has common formative assessments that every teacher gives. No matter the teacher, each child is assessed via the same assessment provided by our district curriculum department which models each assessment after the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or STAAR test. Previous STAAR tests are released and utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums.		
Expected Achievement Levels on academic assessments	The State's Performance Standards can be found on this website: https://tea.texas.gov/student-assessment/testing/staar/staar-performance-standards Blanton tracks each child's growth throughout the year via local assessments (mentioned above), Istation, and IReady. Each child has a folder where teachers help them track their own learning growth.
