New Indiana Diploma

- English requirements (8 credits)

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New Indiana Diploma

- Social Studies requirements (5 credits)
 - US History and Government still required
 - Economics not required
 - World-perspectives course (2 credits)
- PE/Health requirements (2 credits)
 - Health (1 credit) and Physical Education (1 credit)
- Personalized Electives = 17 credits
- Preparing for College and Careers (1 credit)
- Credits required increased from 40 to 42; **local requirement remains 47 credits**



New Indiana Diploma

- Honors Seal and Honors Plus Seal

- Readiness Seals exist for **Enrollment, Employment, Enlistment & Service**
- Completing a Seal satisfies all Graduation Pathway requirements
- Specified credits in certain content areas and/or courses may be outlined.
- Grade or GPA requirements may be identified.
- Work-based Learning hours may be required.
- Specified experiences may be required.
- Attendance requirement may have to be met.
- Demonstration of skills development in communication, collaboration, and work ethic.
- Honors Plus may additionally include completion of Work-Based Learning hours (before/after during school, summer), earning a credential of value, and demonstration of employability skills and leadership.

Steps for College Readiness

- Take **challenging** and **advanced** classes in order to prepare for college-level studies.
 - Your student should take the most challenging course-load based on his/her ability
 - You do NOT need to be a “gifted” student
 - Work toward an Enrollment, Employment or Enlistment and Service Honors/Honors Plus Seal
 - PSAT (9th, 10th, 11th) & SAT (11th)
 - Freshman transcript is **VERY** important!




PE Waiver Information

- **The same sport or activity can only be used once to earn either a PE I or PE II credit**
- **The PE Waiver application and detailed information** will be available on the high school guidance page under [P.E. Waiver](#)
- **The PE Waiver application must be completed** and submitted online by **October 10, 2025**, for Fall Activities and **March 20, 2026**, for Winter Activities & Spring Activities. Students should watch for Schoology announcements about waiver applications.
- Once a student has submitted the waiver form, they will be enrolled into a Schoology course. They will have a few short assignments to complete that are **required to earn the credit**.



Summer Courses for Incoming Freshmen

- No Summer School will be permitted for incoming freshman.
- With the flexibility and opportunity of the New Indiana Diploma, students will have ample time to complete their courses at school.
- Avon High School is proud of the faculty we employ and want all students to have the opportunity to be taught face to face by our wonderful faculty.
- Indiana has prioritized summer school funding towards literacy at the elementary grade levels.



HS Courses Taken in Middle School

- Courses with grades of D+, D, D-, or F will not be listed on the high school transcript and will need to be repeated in 9th grade. Students with course grades of C+, C, or C- are strongly encouraged to repeat as well.
- Courses will be listed on the high school transcript with credit and grade factored into the high school GPA.
- A student may opt out of the two semesters of credit for any or all courses completed in middle school with the following stipulations:
 - An Informed Consent Form must be signed by the parent and submitted by the end of the junior year.
 - Both semesters of the course will be removed from transcript and will no longer factor into high school GPA.
 - Students may move on to the next course in the sequence; however, the student will most likely need to fulfill additional credits for graduation in that content area.




