SBCOE Hosts 2nd Annual Literacy Summit for the Community

SBCOE's Literacy Summit was bigger and better than ever this year, with over 200 educators, families and community members attending. San Benito County Office of Education partnered with the San Benito County Free Library to host the event at the Veteran's Memorial Building in downtown Hollister. SBCOE Director of Curriculum & Instruction and Equity & Access, Mai Cruz, coordinated the event, which featured Dr. Gregory Spencer, a two-time best-selling author and NFL Lifetime Alumni Member. He spoke to the audience about his journey and why it is crucial to work together to ensure every student is literate.

This year's theme, "Words and Numbers: The Building Blocks of Literacy," was designed for participants to explore the critical role of language and numeracy in literacy development. Breakout sessions provided best practices in reading, writing, and math skills, with practical strategies to support literacy growth at home and in school.

SBCOE Teacher Induction Takes Next Step Toward Full Accreditation

SBCOE's Teacher Induction Program took another step forward in the accreditation process by successfully completing a Site Visit from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) January 27-29. Members of the site team met with over 100 participating teachers, coaches, and administrators to evaluate the program. On February 27, the team will be making a recommendation to the CTC. Once it is fully accredited, SBCOE will be able to not only continue operating the Teacher Induction program, but also apply to open new services such as a Clear Administrative Services Credential program. SBCOE Hosts Budget Workshop

School District and Community Board members from around the area came together for Capitol Advisor's Budget Perspectives Workshop on January 17. SBCOE hosted the event, which gave attendees insight and information about the recently released Governor's Budget Proposal for the 2025-26 fiscal year. The current proposal contains few major policy or program changes and includes a COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) of 2.43%. The Governor will make adjustments to his proposal over the next several months before bringing it back in May. The legislature will then pass a budget over the summer.



San Benito County Math Initiative 2.0 Continues

On January 16, the San Benito County Math Initiative 2,0 continued its workshop series by providing training to 48 San Benito County math educators. The workshop was led by Phillip Gonsalves, founder of the Mathematics Coaching Consortium, and Chief Learning Officer for Curated Pathways to Innovation. Participants learned a variety of specific mathematics content around number sense, operations on whole numbers, integers, decimals, LCM, fractions, as well as concrete, effective instructional practices to utilize immediately in their classrooms. SBCMI 2.0 is a five year initiative and is part of the San Benito County Office of Education's Literacy Initiative.

More than 150 administrators and staff from across California joined the session to explore how SBCOE is de-siloing services and building intentional connections between PBIS, SEL, wellness, and mental health supports. The presentation was wellreceived and helped leaders around the state better understand the work being done by SBCOE.

Certificated Staff Members at the Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Preschool returned from the Holiday Break a day before students came back to school and participated in professional development centering around Present Levels and Goals written in an IEP. The professional development stressed the importance of capturing the student's skills and abilities as well as developing goals around areas of need. Students were welcomed back the next day by the Preschool Teachers, Rural Team, and Low Incidence Providers as they transitioned back into the routine of school.

To celebrate the new year, the preschool classrooms kicked off January's Family Fun Day with New Year traditions from various cultures. Students and parents traveled to each classroom to learn about how people in Hawaii, Italy, Mexico, and the Philippines celebrate the new year.

ECE Holds Matriculation Meetings for Families

San Benito County Agencies Collaborate on Threat Assessment

Schools and agencies in San Benito County met in January to collaborate on a common threat assessment to be used in schools across the county. The threat assessment is designed to assist school personnel in identifying students exhibiting concerning behavior related to radicalization to violence. By providing a step by step approach for assessing the risk that is posed, the assessment can help school staff prevent school-based violence and provide support to students.

Representatives from each school district and charter school, in the county were present as well as the San Benito County Behavioral Health, San Benito County Probation, San Benito County Sheriff and Hollister Police Department.
