A. BOARD OPERATIONS

Action: 1. FOUNDATION AID RESOLUTIONS

Resolution authorizing efforts to obtain equitable school funding

Whereas, in 2006, Campaign for Fiscal Equity successfully challenged New York State's school finance system on the grounds that the system underfunded schools and denied students the right to a "basic education" guaranteed by the New York State Constitution; and

Whereas, in 2007, New York State enacted legislation to reform the State's method of allocating resources to school districts in order to comply with the 2006 New York Court of Appeals' order in Campaign for Fiscal Equity v. State of New York; and

Whereas, the Foundation Aid formula, created by New York State, was supposed to result in the allocation of resources to school districts in a more equitable manner; and

Whereas, the way that New York State has funded the Foundation Aid formula since 2008 has resulted in gross inequalities where "minority-as-majority" school districts are nearly three times as likely to be underfunded; and

Whereas, the [insert name of school district] School District has previously suffered and is continuing to suffer from the results of this inequitable funding system; and

Whereas, the Brentwood and Westbury school districts are seeking the support of the other 8 school districts on Long Island (Roosevelt, Freeport, Hempstead, Amityville, Copiague, Central Islip, Uniondale and Wyandanch) that are being similarly underfunded by New York State's inequitable funding system; and

Whereas, our school districts are collectively owed approximately \$485 million in Foundation Aid funding on an annual basis:

Therefore, the Board of Education of the [insert name of school district] School District hereby authorizes the Board President to sign an open letter in support of Brentwood's and Westbury's efforts; and

Therefore, the Board of Education of the [insert name of school district] School District hereby authorizes the board, collectively, or through individual board members, to participate in a press conference, which is tentatively scheduled to be held in late October 2018, in support of the fight for equitable school funding for the children of our school district.

Furthermore, the Board of Education of the [insert name of school district] School District will take the necessary measures to explore the option of filing a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights ("OCR") in an effort to bring federal attention to the discrepancies in New York State's school funding by having OCR conduct a formal investigation of New York State's distribution of Foundation Aid funding. The Board is exploring a potential OCR complaint in order to secure the Foundation Aid funding that is rightfully owed to the children of our District.

Action: 2. AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, the immediate past President did not sign the following 2017-2018 Empire State Program contracts:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorizes the President to execute the Empire State After School Program contracts as indicated below.

CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

Empire State After School Program

1. **RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education approves the Superintendent's recommendation to accept the award for the Empire State After school Program through the Office of Family and Children Services (OFCS). The district will receive \$1.4 million dollars yearly for 5 years with a total

award amount of \$7,016,000. The grant will service students and parents in the following schools: Barack Obama, David Paterson, Franklin, Front, Jackson Annex, Jackson Main, ABGS Middle School, and Hempstead High School. The grant funded period is: September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2022.

2. RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approves the Superintendent's recommendation to enter into a partnership agreement with CulturePlay. CulturePlay serves as the M/WBE and lead partner for the grant. CulturePlay is a STEM based program that prepares students for college, and places a strong emphasis on developing students' social, academic, and emotional needs. Students from the six (6) elementary schools, middle school and high school will be targeted. The program will run from January 2, 2018 through August 31, 2018, inclusive of a Summer Camp for students. Agreement amount covers all expenses, supplies, and material cost. This project will be paid for through the Empire State \$415,000.

SFP is an evidence-based family skills training program found to significantly reduce problem behaviors, delinquency, and alcohol and drug abuse in children and to improve social competencies and school performance. Cost - \$47,000
