APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT OF IMPROPER LABOR CHARGE

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2022, the Hempstead Schools Administrators Association ("HSAA") filed a Charge with the Public Employment Relations Board ("PERB") alleging that the District violated N.Y. Civil Service Law §209-a.1 (d) when the District appointed employees in the Hempstead Classroom Teachers Association ("HCTA") to fulfill administrator duties, which the HSAA alleged is exclusively HSAA work ("PERB Charge"); and

WHEREAS, the District denies violating N.Y. Civil Service Law §209-a.1 (d); and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Schools, by Labor Counsel for the District, has negotiated a Stipulation of Settlement resolving the PERB Charge; and

WHEREAS, the Board has concluded, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, that it is in the best interests of the district to resolve the PERB Charge by means of the negotiations Stipulation of Settlement, which was executed by the HSAA on January 26, 2023; be it

RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves and adopts the Stipulation of Settlement, and with it the resolution of the PERB Charge; and it is

FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Board hereby authorizes the Board President or authorized designee to execute the Stipulation of Settlement on behalf of the District.
