January 24 – January 31:

Grade 8 counselors distribute POS and explain process and timelines.

February 5 (February 6 snow date):

8th *Grade Open House* 7:00 p.m. Fairfield Ludlowe High School Auditorium

February 10-13:

Grade 8 teachers will spend class time discussing department courses and signing course selection sheets.

February 18 – FWMS, February 19 FWMS/RLMS/TMS, February 20 RLMS/TMS:

High school counselors visit middle schools to discuss course selection with students. Students select electives in Infinite Campus.

March 5-10:

Course Request Verification sheets are distributed to all students for verification of course choices. Make corrections only. Parents and students sign.

March 10:

Deadline for students return signed Course Request Verification sheets to counselors.

Late August:

Freshman Preview Day at FLHS.

August 25:

Freshman Orientation, First day of school for all 9th grade students

FAIRFIELD LUDLOWE HIGH SCHOOL

Grade 9 Course Offerings

English: English 9 Honors (00110) or English 9 College Prep (00120) **Credit: 1**
Students are recommended for the appropriate course level based upon academic ability and performance in eighth grade English.

Mathematics: Foundations of Algebra (20000), Algebra I Honors (20010), Algebra I (20120), Geometry Honors (22210), Geometry (22220), Algebra II Honors (23310) or Algebra II (23320) **Credit: 1**
All students are placed in the appropriate course level in Mathematics based on their preparation and teacher recommendation.

Science: Biology Honors (30210) or Biology (30220) **Credit: 1**
Students are recommended for the appropriate level based upon academic ability and performance in eighth grade Science.

Social Studies: Global Studies Honors (10181) or Global Studies (10182) **Credit: 1**
Students are recommended for the appropriate course level based upon academic ability and performance in eighth grade Social Studies.

Physical Education: Physical Education 1 **Credit: .5**
Required. Meets one semester either grade 9 or grade 10.

Health: Health 1 **Credit: .5**
Required. Meets one semester either grade 9 or grade 10.

Electives: Arts, Business, Family & Consumer Science, Media and News Production, Music, Technology and Engineering Ed Education, and Theater Arts (courses listed on reverse) **Credit: .5 or 1**
Students may select up to 2.5 elective credits. Students must have a minimum of 1 full year (1 credit) course or 2 semester (.5) courses. Please consult the Program of Studies for prerequisites and course sequences.

World Language: American Sign Language, French, Italian, Latin, Mandarin, or Spanish **Credit: 1**
There is one credit diploma requirement. However, two or more years of a world language is recommended for students who plan to consider post-secondary education. Students beginning a language may take American Sign Language I, French I, Italian I, Latin I, Mandarin (Chinese) I, or Spanish I in Grade 9. Students currently taking a world language may continue at the appropriate level. Course numbers on reverse.
