- It is not equal - a para is not going to be willing to support me. para's are not equal pushing back on teachers. Afraid teachers are not tech saavy.
  - Para pros - need to support the library and teachers
- Great idea - Maker Space- a lot of decisions still need to be made. Lots of PD and solving problems.
- 3D printer - we can't even get our regular printer serviced.
- Good to prepare the students to the 21 Century. However with high turnover of teachers how are we planning to build the capacity.
- Great First step - Phase I Person Digital technology. More than a Para at the elementary. Instructional Technology Coaches too. There are so many plates in the air they need to be connected.
- Tech Coach is a teacher during the day. There needs to be a tech person in the building full time.
- Need to make a plea to the district that a full time librarian is important.

- In regards to where students need to be. Students will learn to use these things. They are doing things that matter to them.
- Long time coming. How many buildings have space? What are we really able to do?
- Roll out to administrators as to what they need to do to make this happen.
- Have a building that has the space and have a teacher that is willing to commit to it.
- It is a need that we have to address. It does have to do with who we have in the library.  
Checking with every school as to where are they at this level?
  - There is an application process that should be done with a principal, teacher, and para pro
  - Curriculum is good and needed to be layed out this way.
- Who made the decision to change?
  - Needed to rewrite library curriculum. Also to engage curriculum you need to rework the space.

  - There are allotted times during the day for the student to receive help and to get support.
- If there is follow up in the schools after they transition will there also be follow up for those who are jr or sr if they never transition back to their HS?
  - Currently there is no plan to follow-up. However, plans are in building stages
- Enrollment, quota, any not taken, what if no parent involvement.
  - 120 current enrollment, 140 is capacity. With no parent involvement a student can not be in the program.
- Plan for more electives?
  - Students start at 9 because we would like them to take electives at their home school.
- Sounds like there is extensive training, and this can be a very emotional job, is there a plan to measure staff retention?
  - Staff does have opportunities to debrief
- As making the decision to leave their home school may be scary and difficult, is there some PR effort to show students that this may be a better choice for their own life goals?
  - We would like the students to be successful at their home school first.
- What is the expected length of day for a teacher?
  - 7:45/7:50 - 3:05
- Alternative to the alternative what about students like that?
  - ROE program
