The Gist with Fr. Jeremy



The Oft-Ignored Warnings of Conscience

A long time ago I bought the Lord of the Rings trilogy on audiobook format and I listen to them fairly often in the car or while eating or at other times. It is a great way to keep my favorite books fresh in my head, and I feel like I am constantly noticing beauty and wisdom in lines and scenes where I haven't noticed it

before. I wanted to share one such line that I noticed for the first time just the other day while I was listening to the second book: *The Two Towers*.

Those who have read the books or seen the movies will remember the scene where Pippin looks into the palantir. For those who have not, the palantir is sort of like a crystal ball that the evil wizard Saruman uses to communicate with the more evil dark lord Sauron. After a critical victory over Saruman, the good wizard Gandalf is parlaying with him, when one of Saruman's servants flings the palantir at Gandalf, thinking it to be a handy projectile for injuring him, and not realizing the importance it has for his master.

The palantir misses Gandalf and gets picked up by Pippin – a rather childish character – who doesn't know what it is, but immediately becomes very curious and interested in it. Gandalf hastily takes it away from him and gruffly tells him not to handle it. But Pippin's curiosity continues to gnaw at him the rest of that day, and even won't let him sleep. Finally, to satisfy his restlessness, he gets up late at night and steals the palantir from the sleeping Gandalf, and begins to stare into it. Before long he finds himself talking with the dark lord Sauron who terrifies him so badly that he screams out, wakes everyone up, and his theft is discovered.

Later Gandalf is sternly telling Pippin how foolish he was, and how lucky he is that the enemy did not use the palantir to force Pippin to reveal his knowledge of their plans against Sauron. After a long lecture, Pippin – feeling thoroughly chastised – cries out, "I wish I had known all this before, I had no notion of what I was doing." To which Gandalf replies, "O yes you had. You knew you were behaving wrongly and foolishly; and you told yourself so, though you did not listen."

This is the line that struck me, and the reason is that I love how Gandalf doesn't put up with Pippin's attempt to plead ignorance. Even though Pippin didn't know exactly what the palantir was, he still had enough moral instincts, also known as conscience, to know that this wasn't a good idea.

The voice of conscience is rarely clear and specific, which makes it easy to ignore. And if we ignore the instinctual voice of conscience and then something bad happens, we will want to say that we are not to blame, but in reality the instincts of conscience are sufficient for us to make responsible decisions, and if we choose to ignore them, what happens next is on us, even if we can't foresee it with perfect clarity.

One example of this is if we are watching a movie and a vulgar scene comes up, or if we are surfing the internet and end up on a vulgar website, it can be easy to say,

"I didn't know that was coming," but if we are attentive, very often our conscience was giving us warning signals that we ignored. We know perfectly well how common that stuff is, and we know perfectly well when we are wandering into areas where we might stumble across it. But do we pay attention to those warnings and take necessary precautions?

This is not the only example, but it is a particularly relevant one, which is why I think it is very fitting that this moral lesson emerges from a scene where the character was *looking* at something he shouldn't have been looking at. Ultimately the lesson comes down to this: it is very easy to ignore our conscience, and that means we are often not as ignorant as we might like to think. We should learn how to pay more attention to the red flags and warning signals that our conscience gives us!



Prayers for Dcn. Pat Bruen St. John Vianney Traveling Statue





Conversion in Medjugorje Catholic Treasures Article 3 of 3

Several children in Medjugorje, which is in Boznia-Herzegovina, began to hear messages from the Blessed Mother on June 24, 1981. The messages continue to this day and are received by the visionaries on a monthly basis. The messages can be grouped into five themes: peace, the need for peace between God and man and between peoples; faith, the need for belief in God as the foundation of all earthly desires; conversion, without which there is no peace; prayer, to strengthen our disordered relationship to God; fasting, to restrain our disordered pleasure seeking and gain solidarity with the poor. Medjugorje became a popular pilgrimage site in the 1980's but only received approval in 2024 when it was granted the "nihl obstat," the declaration that the Church has no objection to the faithful reverencing the site. The faithful are not required to believe in the messages or the visionaries as saints. The messages are considered personal revelations and not part of the Doctrine of Faith or the official teachings, the Magisterium of the Church.

Fruits of Medjugorje

I was asked to become a group leader for pilgrimages to Medjugorje and have had many amazing experiences along the way. One time, I sat next to a man who had his headphones on almost the whole flight, bouncing up and down in his seat, keeping time to the music. Finally, as the airplane was descending, he took off his headphones. I had a booklet of Our Lady's messages on my lap and I said to Jesus silently that if this man looks at them, I will talk to him about Medjugorje and offer him the booklet. I saw him glance at the booklet twice. Then I asked him if he had ever heard of Medjugorje. He said, "Yes, I have heard of it." Then he explained that he currently worked for the L.A. Lakers Basketball Team. He said that one of the players was always talking about Medjugorje in the locker room. He gladly took the booklet I had on my lap. Then unexpectedly he asked me, "Do you mind if I make copies of this Medjugorje message booklet and distribute them to all the L.A. Lakers Basketball Team?" I was overjoyed and said "Yes, please make as many copies as you want!" What a grace this was! Praise God!!

Shortly after my entry into the Catholic Church, I attended Mass at Sacred Heart parish in Dearborn. As I was exiting the church, I saw a flyer about an ecumenical gathering of religious leaders who were meeting with members of their parishes and congregations at one of the local parks that very day to pray for peace in our world. I felt prompted to go back into the church and pray before the tabernacle about this event. As I was praying, I heard in my heart Jesus say that He wanted me to put up a table in the park with the booklets of Our Lady's Medjugorje messages. I grabbed my card table from home and went to the park. There were hundreds of people there and I was blessed to distribute many booklets to people of many different faiths. A Michigan Catholic newspaper reporter came by the table and interviewed me about Our Lady's messages spreading her messages even further. Praise God!!

The Mary Our Mother (MOM) Foundation began placing display stands with CDs that the ministry produced in parishes, schools, and retreat centers. I would go to these sites to replenish the CDs. One day, I was at St. Martha's in Dearborn when an elderly gentleman came in and said he was trying to get to his medical appointment, but was lost. I walked out with him to point him in the right direction. As I was walking, I heard Jesus say in my heart to give him one of the Medjugorje message booklets. I told him to wait a moment as I had something in my car to give to him. As I explained about the messages and gave him the booklet, he started to cry. He said he would definitely read it as he had just been diagnosed with a serious illness and these messages were the hope he needed! Mary Queen of Peace, Pray for us!!







May couples generously live out their vocation with openness to the gift of new life.

The month of February has traditionally been dedicated to the Holy Family who provide for us a model of marriage and family life. Mary and Joseph perfectly witness to the gift of new life, welcoming the infant Jesus amidst difficult and challenging circumstances. God designed the love of husband and wife to be so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with Himself and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being whom they will love and care for together. Part of God's gift to husband and wife is cooperation with His creative power. In participating in this "great mystery" of love that is total, faithful, and fruitful, married couples become a sign of the love between Christ and His Church (Eph 5:32). Couples who cannot bear children still share in this cooperation. As St. John Paul II affirmed to such couples, "You are no less loved by God; your love for each other is complete and fruitful when it is open to others."

While a couple does not need to seek to have a child in every act of intercourse, they should never act to reject the life-giving power granted by God through the use of contraception. In deliberately acting to suppress their fertility, couples harm their unity. For serious reasons, couples may choose to avoid pregnancy for a time or indefinitely. Natural Family Planning (NFP) can help married couples identify and utilize the naturally infertile times in a woman's cycle, all while cooperating with God's design.

In today's culture, living out God's plan for married love and opening our hearts to the gift of children can be difficult. It can often require great generosity and trust in the Lord. But as Christ repeatedly exhorted, "Be not afraid!" The Church's teaching on married love is an invitation to let God transform our hearts, knowing God's plan is far richer than anything the world can offer us.






