What is the SAT?

The SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) is a standardized test widely used for college admissions in the United States. It is designed to measure a student's readiness for college and provides colleges with a common data point for comparing applicants.



How is the SAT structured?

The SAT is composed of two sections: (1) the Reading and Writing section, and (2) the Math section. You have 64 minutes to complete the Reading and Writing section and 70 minutes to complete the Math section for a total of 2 hours and 14 minutes.

College Readiness Scores:

Reading/Writing Section: 480+

Math Section: 530+
