
Show Choir Classic 2025

Thanks to a grant through the LaCrosse Youth Climate Action Fund, Aditi Muduganti was able to write, illustrate and publish her own children's book.


Her story called "Tech Tales," was her way of teaching children the importance of sustainability. She wanted kids to know that they could play an important part in helping the environment.



N FACT CHECK



MYTH: You can't learn two languages at the same time. If you do, you'll end up getting confused, messed up, and horribly fail.

REALITY: Who on Earth says you can't learn many languages simultaneously? Citizens from bilingual countries or families have proven this wrong. If you can learn Physics while learning Biology or History while learning Geography, then you can learn French while learning Spanish. It is a mental workout that strengthens the brain. The real answer is yes, oui, si.

A Look at University Retro Active Credits

Last month, we looked at world language admission requirements at colleges and universities. This month, we will look at retroactive credits. Retroactive credits are free credits students may earn by taking an upper-level course and earning a grade of B or better. The student earns retro-active credits for all the lower classes skipped. For example, a common layout for university world language classes is: 101, 102, 201, 202, and 303. If a student is placed into a 201 course and earns a B, that student could receive retroactive credits for 101 and 102. With each class worth 3 to 4 credits, the student would have earned a total of 9 to 12 credits. The best part, the student only has to pay for the credits from the class s/he took. This way, the student 6-8 earned free credits!

The process of placement testing at the university level is simple. Once admitted to a University of Wisconsin system school, students take an entrance exam in math, English, and world language. From this exam, the university decides which world language class is a best fit. Students may opt out to take a lower-level class than which is being recommended by the university, but University of Wisconsin has a history of successfully placing students in the proper world language course.

The economic benefit of long-term world language study can amount to one semester of free tuition. For example, according to the UW-La Crosse website, one semester of tuition for a Wisconsin resident is \$4,658. If an average student takes fifteen credits per semester, the breakdown cost per credit is \$310 dollars. Now take into account a student placed into the highest level of world language study (301). After a semester of study at level 301 and earning a B or higher grade, the student would earn 12 to 16 retroactive credits for the classes skipped. The math is simple, 12 credits at \$310 each equal \$3,720 dollars and 16 credits equals \$4960 dollars of free credits.

There is no guarantee for placing in the highest level of a world language course in college which is why we recommend students study



ACT Updates

The University of Wisconsin System has suspended the ACT requirement for all UW colleges and universities **through the 2026-2027 academic year.** Many other colleges have also waived the ACT requirement. A strong ACT score can still help with admission to college and scholarship placement. Since most schools are now "test optional", students can choose not to use a score if they are not pleased with it. Students will choose if they wish to include their ACT scores as part of their application. Visit the websites of your colleges for more information.

ACT Prep Course Options

Preparing for the ACT can increase test scores to gain entry into the college of your choice and receive scholarships. There are several options that are available each year, which can help students prepare for this test.

- 1. All Juniors took a FREE practice ACT test on September 24. This retired ACT test was administered, timed and will be scored identically to an actual ACT. ACT will score this test, and provide students with sub scores, a composite score and most importantly an itemized list of correct answers compared to the student answers. Students can log into their Act Online Prep account at https://onlineprep.act.org/login to view their results, review their answers, identify content they need more review, use online tutorials, and take additional practice tests.
- 2. UW-L's Continuing Education office offers an ACT prep course costing \$199. Students will learn test-taking strategies, receive instruction in each of the four testing areas, and take a retired pre- and post-ACT test. Writing strategies to assist you in the essay part of the ACT test will also be provided. Visit https://www.uwlax.edu/gel/ypc/act-test-preponline/ for more information.

Early College Credit, Start College Now, and Youth Apprenticeship Programs

ECCP and SCN Programs

Students at OHS have several unique opportunities they can take advantage of typically during their junior or senior years. The Early College Credit Program (ECCP) for private and public 4-year colleges and Start College Now (SCN) for technical colleges offer students an opportunity to take college courses at Western, Viterbo or UW-L at no cost to them or their families. A student must have exhausted all course offerings in a content area at OHS and meet the college's admissions criteria in order to be approved for these programs. Application forms can be found on the OHS Website and on the grade level google classroom pages. Students should contact their School Counselor for more information and be sure to turn in an application before February 28, 2025. **NO LATE APPLICATIONS CAN BE ACCEPTED!**

Youth Apprenticeship

Students who participate in a Youth Apprenticeship are able to learn essential skills under the supervision of a skilled mentor while earning high school credit. Juniors and Seniors who have part-time jobs in areas including food service, banking, automotive, construction, computer science, agriculture, nursing assistant or other related careers who are interested in earning high school credit for their employment should see Mrs. DeLong in Student Services for more information about the Youth Apprenticeship program! Eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch?
