Math (Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Algebra, + 1 additional course)	4
Science (Biology, Physical Science or Physics, + 2 additional Courses)	4
Social Studies (American Govt (semester), World History, US History, Econ (semester)	3
Health & Personal Fitness	1
Career Tech and/or World Language and/or Fine Arts	3
Additional Electives	4
Total Credits (minimum)	23



Earning Your Way – BY THE NUMBERS

- ✓ Number of credits needed to graduate = 23
- ✓ 1 semester course = **0.5** credit
- √ 6 classes x 0.5 credit each semester = 3 credits per semester
- ✓ 3 credits x 2 semesters =6 credits per year



World Language, Career Tech, and/or Fine Arts



Students planning to ENTER or TRANSFER into a 4-year college must take a minimum of 2 units of the same World Language.

Some 2-year Georgia colleges may have this requirement as well.







Health/Physical Education

Graduation Requirement: 1 Unit

- Health
- Personal Fitness

*Personal Fitness Waiver

Students who meet one of the following requirements can request to waive out of the Personal Fitness class that is required for graduation. Students MUST complete the Personal Fitness Waiver Request Form and receive approval prior to the end of their junior year of high school.

- 1 Season of a GHSA sport (excludes One-Act Play, Literary Competitions and Esports)
- 1 Season of a Non-GHSA sport (Non-GHSA sports must have a clear start and end date, defined practice schedule, involve physical activity, and include a record of participation. Program sponsors must provide documentation ensuring a student has completed the above requirements in good standing.
- 1 Season of Marching Band
- .5 credit of Dance, Cirque or Physical Education electives

The Registration Process

Step 1: Course Placement by Teachers

- **Dates**: January 21 31, 2025
- Details: Teachers will make course recommendations for students, based on the AHS Indicators of Success (prerequisite course requirements) using students' unweighted grades from the first semester. Students are encouraged to review the online course catalog to gain an understanding of which courses are most appropriate to their abilities and interests. Students should speak with their current teachers regarding course placements for the 2025–2026 school year.

The Registration Process

Step 2: Review & Submit Initial Course Request Verification

• **Dates**: February 4 – 14, 2025

• **Details:** Students and parents can view the students' initial course request verification on the Campus Student or Parent Portal, which lists the courses recommended by their teachers for the 2025-2026 school year. At this time, students may change their teachers' recommendations and select their elective courses as well as listing alternative or back-up electives by following directions on the Microsoft form.





The Registration Process

- The Course Requests that you see in the Campus portal were generated from Teacher recommendations.
- View course requests for the 2025-2026 school year on the Campus Parent or Student portal:
 - In the portal, select "More" in the menu to the left.
 - Select "Next Year Course Request"
 - View Student Course Requests.
- Review the course recommendations and make any necessary changes as well as selecting elective courses.
- You will use the Microsoft Form QR Code or link to accomplish this task.
- The INITIAL course request verification form must be submitted by 11:59 pm on February 14th.
- Your changes and elective changes will be reviewed and entered. The FINAL course request verification with these changes included must be submitted by May 9th with any additional course requests or changes noted.
- Please choose your courses wisely. After the FINAL course request verifications, there will be <u>no course request changes</u>.

GOAL = 6: A Complete Yearlong Schedule of Classes

- Courses = Year or Semester
- Yearlong classes comprised of 2 semester courses with the course numbers ending in 1 or 2

Example: Biology

- 26.0120001 (1st semester)
- 26.0120002 (2nd Semester)
- In the PORTAL:
 - Semester course numbers = 0.5 credits
 - Yearlong course numbers = 1.0 credits

- A complete schedule in the Portal should total 6.0 credits
 - Lunch -1st Sem = No units (0)
 - Lunch -2^{nd} Sem = No units (0)
 - Gifted Participation, starting with 70.23xxxxx is not a course and carries no units of credit. The course number is used to identify students in the TAG Program.
 - Students taking courses outside of the regular school day of courses may have additional units.
