What Is The Role Of System Leaders?

Board of Education of Charles County

- Establishes educational and fiscal policy.
- Provides overall direction and governs Charles County Public Schools (CCPS).
- Nine Board members are elected by registered voters. Elections held every four years.
- Serves four-year term.
- The Student Member of the Board (SMOB) is elected by students annually each spring.

Superintendent of Schools

- Manages the fiscal and day-to-day operations of CCPS.
- Oversees the administration of schools.
- Makes decisions on policy and procedures.
- Creates strategic decisions to ensure student learning and success.
- Appointed by the Board of Education of Charles County.
- Serves a four-year term.

Who Is In Our Schools, continued?

Pupil Personnel Worker (PPW)

PPW's work with parents, community agencies, teachers, School Counselors, School Psychologists, and other educational specialists both inside and outside the school.

School Counselor

School Counselors are in every Charles County public elementary, middle and high school, and learning centers. Counselors work with students, parents and school staff to ensure that all students become effective learners, achieve success in school and become contributing members of society.

School Resource Officer (SRO)

The Charles County Sheriff's Office School Resource Unit assigns one officer to each middle and high school in Charles County as part of an agreement with CCPS. The School Resource Officers work closely with the administrative staff and teachers at their respective schools to enhance school safety and address security matters.

School Psychologist

School Psychologists have specialized training in both psychology and education. They use their training and skills to team with educators, parents, and other mental health professionals to ensure that every child learns in a safe, healthy and supportive environment.



Who Is In Our Schools?

Community Engagement and Equity Liaison

The Community Engagement & Equity (CEE) Liaisons will lead school-based professional learning, support school improvement planning, and work with the CEE office on district level initiatives. This role is in alignment with the county's Strategic Plan and supports Educational Equity Policy 1820 implementation.

Community School Coordinator

Community schools serve as hubs that bring families, communities, and partners together to remove barriers to learning. Using an asset-based approach, community schools strive to strengthen connections to generate improved student outcomes. Schools work to provide access to high-quality academics, health services, mental health support, academic enrichment, out-of-school time programming, crisis support, adult education classes, leadership development, and more thought the community.

Citizen Parent Advisory Committee Representative

The Citizen Parent Advisory Committee serves as an essential voice for parents and community members, providing input on decisions that affect students' education while helping to strengthen the partnership between families and the school system. The committee offers recommendations on school policies, programs, and initiatives that impact students and the community.

Volunteer Coordinator

Each school has a Volunteer Coordinator who is responsible for managing and overseeing the involvement of volunteers in various school activities. Volunteer coordinators help create a smooth partnership between the school and its unpaid stakeholders, ensuring that both the volunteers and the school community benefit from the experience.

Title I Parent Liaison

Title I is a federally funded program that provides extra academic support to schools. A Title I parent liaison is a school staff member who helps build relationships between parents, teachers, and the community. They also help schools implement programs that encourage parental involvement.

PTO/PTSO Executive Leadership

PTO/PTSO executive team is a group of dedicated individuals working together to create a positive, supportive, and active school community that benefits students, teachers, and families alike. The roles on the executive team are usually divided among various officers, each with their specific responsibilities.


