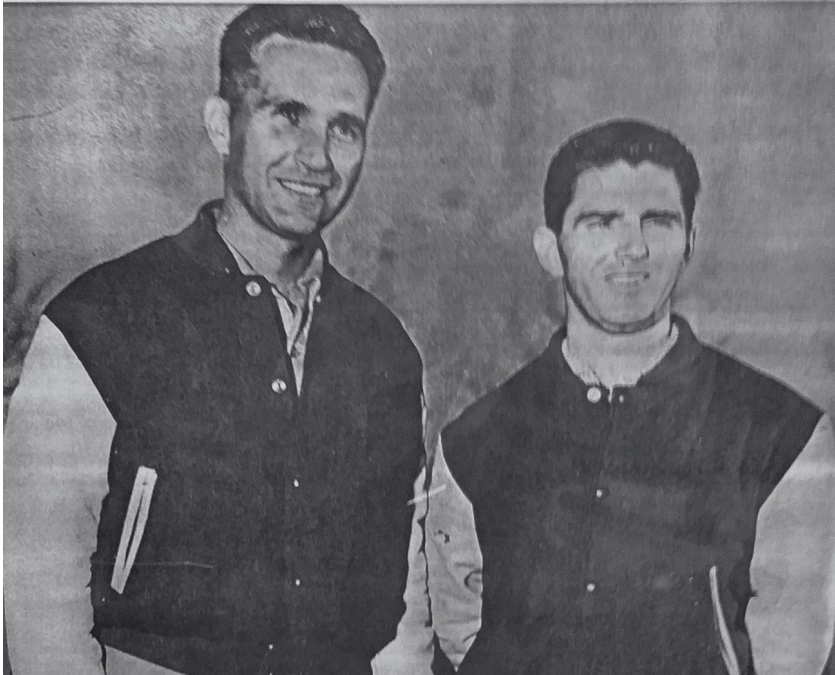

Jerry Black

Coach

Football~ Basketball~ Baseball



Jerry served 38 years as a teacher, coach and administrator in the Liberty Union High School District.

The Liberty Union High School Athletic Hall of Fame is proud to induct Jerry Black. The 22-year old Black came to Liberty High School in the fall of 1969 from Fresno State University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education and life sciences. He served 38 years as a teacher, coach and administrator in the Liberty Union High School District. He continued his education, earning a master's degree in pupil personnel from the University of La Verne and an administrative credential from Chapman University.

During Black's distinguished career, he influenced the lives of many students and youth in the District and community. At Liberty, he taught biology, science and mathematics; coached baseball, football and basketball; and served as guidance counselor and head counselor. He also served as assistant director of community education at Independent High School and was a leader in youth sports in the East County. In each role, Jerry was fully devoted to the students and families he served.

If you attended Liberty between 1969 and 1988, you knew this man as Coach Black. In his early career, he held assistant coaching positions in football, basketball and baseball. In 1976, Coach Black was appointed varsity baseball coach and served in that position for 13 years. During his tenure, Coach Black continuously produced competitive teams and prepared man players to succeed at the college level. His Lions won the Foothill Athletic League Championship in 1978 and that team was inducted into the District Hall of Fame in 2009. Coach Black's teams won many baseball tournaments, including the prestigious Alhambra Easter Classic three times.

Coach Black was a teacher of the game, mentoring not only his players but his assistant coaches at all levels. Sports reporter Eric Gilmore authored an article about him in the Antioch Ledger, titled *A Position of Coaching Power*. In that piece, Gilmore wrote, "A high school coach is a dictator. He has the power to make athletics an exciting, enjoyable learning experience - or a nightmare. That's why it is reassuring to have a person like Liberty High School's Jerry Black in charge of their school's baseball program. Black conducts himself like a Boy Scout troop leader. He stays calm as a guru. That's not to say Black ignores the scoreboard. He wants to win, and he consistently produces well-drilled, winning teams. Any coach or athlete understands the exhilaration and strives for victory. But the quality coaches, like Black, put winning in perspective. A very wise use of power."

During his years living in Brentwood, Coach Black served on the Brentwood Recreation's Youth Baseball Board. He conducted and coordinated many youth baseball and basketball clinics for the community, and also headed the committee that brought Pony League baseball to Brentwood and helped initiate the CYO basketball program in Brentwood through the Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is honored to induct Jerry Black into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding coaching career at Liberty Union High School, and his contributions to our community.

Darrell Greene

Athlete

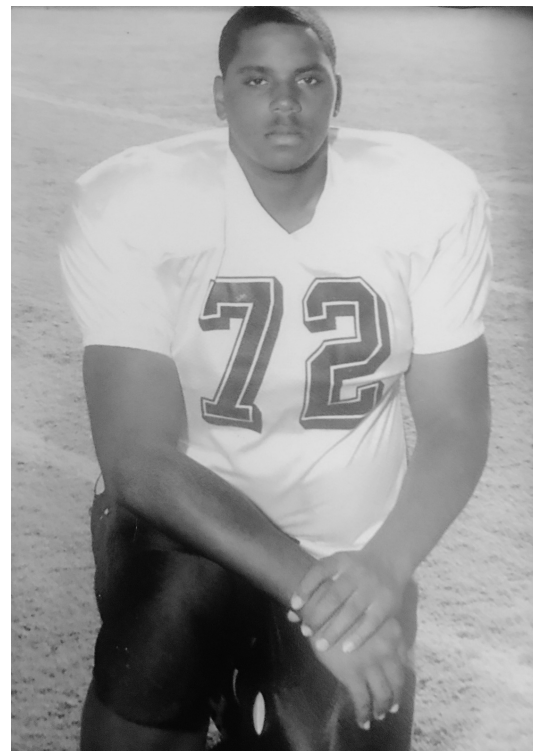
Football ~ Basketball

Darrell Greene attended Freedom High School from 2007 to 2011 and distinguished himself as an outstanding dual sport athlete. Darrell was a three-year varsity letterman in basketball and two-year letterman in football. Darrell's junior year was the starting point for his success in Freedom athletics. He was awarded 2nd team All BVAL in both sports and voted Most Valuable Lineman by his peers on the football team. In his senior campaign, Darrell excelled on the football field and earned All BVAL Offensive Lineman honors, BVAL top Offensive Lineman, 2010 Team Most Valuable Lineman and Bay Area Cream of the Crop Offensive Lineman. Darrell's success on the football field carried over to the hardwood as he was awarded All BVAL honors and he led his team in rebounds.

After his career at Freedom High School, Darrell enrolled at San Diego State University on a full football scholarship and developed into an outstanding lineman for the Aztecs. Darrell made his way onto the field in 2013 and played in all 13 games with 12 consecutive starts to end the season. In 2014, Darrell was named Honorable Mention All Mountain West selection and was also named to the MW preseason 4th team by Phil Steele. He started all 14 games for the Aztecs at right guard. Darrell's final season picked up where it left off with him being named a preseason 1st Team Mountain West selection, and highlighted in Lindy's Sports and ESPN College Football Preview. He was also a second-team pick by Athlon Sports and was deemed the Mountain West Best Run Blocker by Lindy's Sports. Darrell's success at San Diego State lead him to sign as a free agent with the Philadelphia Eagles. Darrell remained on the Eagles practice squad for 3 years and in 2018 he helped the Eagles win the Superbowl LII. In 2019, Darrell signed with the San Diego Fleet of the Alliance American Football league until the league folded and finished his football career that season with the Calgary Stampede of the Canadian Football League.

Darrell earned his BA in Sociology at San Diego State University in 2016 and is currently working as a bank teller for Loomis Bank in Atlanta, Georgia.

The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct Darrell Greene into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding athletic career at Freedom High School, San Diego State University and on this professional football success.

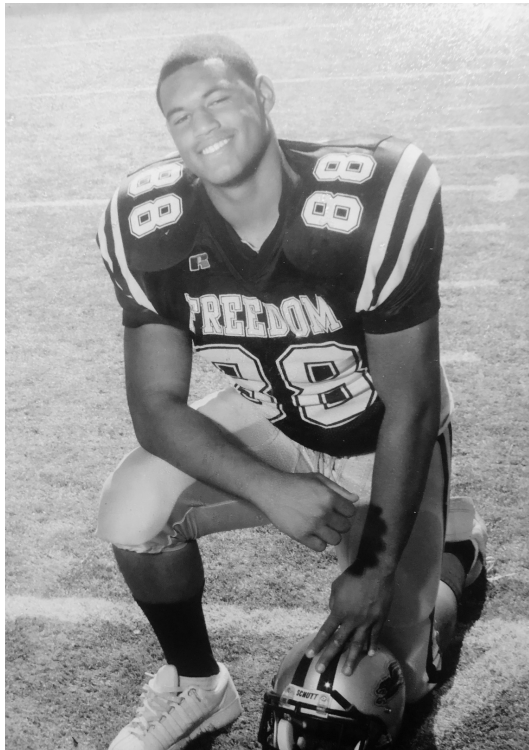

Sevaro Johnson

Sevaro currently still holds the record for career sacks with 22 over his career at Freedom High School.

Sevaro Johnson attended Freedom High School from 2001 - 2005. During those four years, Sevaro was both an outstanding Football and Basketball player. After graduating from Freedom High School, he attended Eastern Washington University on a full football scholarship. After his first season at EWU, Sevaro transferred to Laney College in Oakland for one season. After an amazing season at Laney, Sevaro accepted a full football scholarship to attend Colorado State University where he earned his Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies. He is currently the National Account Manager for Otter Box Products.

Sevaro played basketball (2-year varsity) all four years at Freedom High School. Sevaro was voted by his peers as team MVP both his freshman and JV years in basketball. During his junior year, he was Honorable mention All BVAL, ALL Bay Area and All State. Sevaro averaged 11.3 pts and 13 rebounds per game. His Senior year started off where he left off after his junior campaign and was averaging 10 pts and 13 rebounds per game at the end of the preseason schedule. Unfortunately, he suffered a season ending injury the first game of BVAL play.

Although Sevaro had a successful basketball career, football was his first love. He played football all four years at FHS. He was a 3-year starter on Varsity as both a Defensive End and Tight End. During his sophomore year, he earned Honorable mention All BVAL DE; junior year, Team Captain, voted team MV Defense, 2nd Team ALL BVAL as a Defensive End and Tight End; senior year, voted team captain & team MVP, 1st team All BVAL as a Defensive End and Tight End, All Metro, All Region, All NorCal and All Bay Area Cream of the Crop. Sevaro currently still holds the record for Career sacks with 22 over his career at Freedom High School.

After transferring from Eastern Washington to Laney College in Oakland, Sevaro made an immediate impact there by achieving 1st team All-Conference Defensive Lineman in 2007 and helped turn around Laney's program by completing a 10-1 season and winning their second consecutive bowl game (Graffiti Bowl).

Sevaro's efforts at Laney College earned him a football Scholarship to Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado. He played Defensive tackle for the Rams and made his debut in the season opener against University of Colorado where he tipped a pass that lead to an interception for the Rams. He saw action throughout his junior year and had a great game in his old backyard versus University of California Bears. His senior campaign ended with a season ending injury during fall camp.

Sean Packard

As a new school especially, Heritage looked for students that had the desire to make a difference and create programs that future Patriots would proudly want to be a part of, filled with student-athletes of character. Sean Packard had been raised by parents that encouraged him to be just that kind of person.

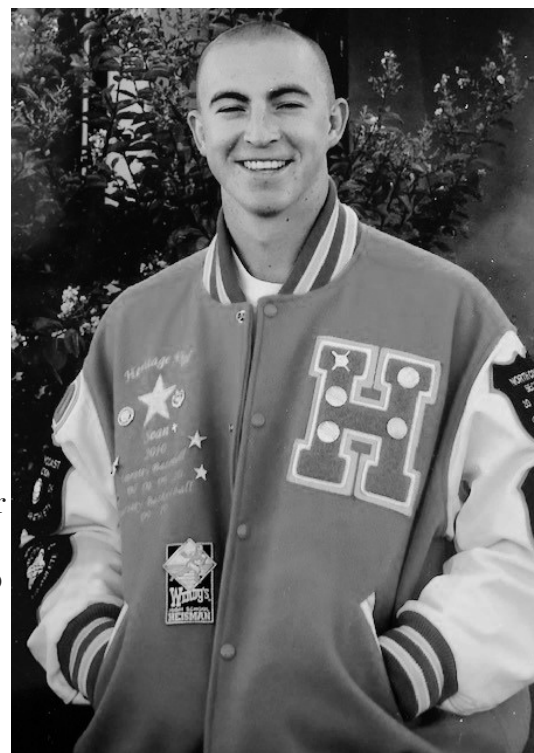
Sean was a 4 year athlete in basketball and baseball. In basketball he was a 2 year Letterman, captain, starting point guard and winner of the "Dedication & Desire" award. As a junior his team made the NCS Semi-finals with a 19-9 record. In his senior year, Sean was named Tournament MVP at the McKinleyville Tip-Off Classic, which was won by the Patriots, and helped lead his team to the school's first BVAL Boys Basketball title with a record of 22-6. Sean finished his high school basketball career by being named 1st team all-league and had been nominated for league MVP. His coach, Pat Cruickshank states, "Sean was the "coach on the floor", the glue of the team and an absolute joy to coach."

On the baseball diamond, Sean earned a varsity letter and was a starting pitcher for the Patriots all four years. Sean also played shortstop and 3rd base during his career. The first few years of Heritage High School the baseball the team had .500 seasons. In Sean's senior year with his commitment to his team, resolve as a player and leadership as a captain the 2010 team went 21-6 overall and 14-1 in league to earn the school's first ever, BVAL Baseball Championship.

The most remarkable and memorable thing about Sean's senior year was his return to baseball after breaking his jaw while practicing early in the season. After missing five weeks and losing 20 pounds, he was ready to return to action just in time for the 1st round NCS game against Berkeley High School, in which he went 3-3 with three doubles. The final double came when Heritage was down 0-1 in the last inning, and with 2 outs and 2 strikes in the count, Sean hit an RBI double up the gap leading to a subsequent walk off win. His Coach Kevin Brannan said, "It was something out of a movie and it couldn't have happen to a nicer human being than Sean Packard."

Sean carried a 4.0 GPA throughout high school, was involved in student leadership and other clubs. He was an NCS Scholar Athlete every season in both basketball and baseball. He earned the Athletic Director's Award each season, recognizing athletic and academic excellence. Sean was the Wendy's High School Heisman award winner and the Farmer's CIF Scholar Athlete of the Year candidate. He rounded out his amazing athletic career by being named Heritage High School's 2010 *Male Athlete of the Year*.

Sean attended Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and he continued his athletic career as a member and officer of the Club Baseball team from 2011 - 2014. Sean earned a Bachelor's of Science in Environmental Engineering, graduating Magna Cum Laude, and has a career as a Project Engineer. He continued with the Cal Poly club baseball team as a coach from 2014 - 2018. The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct Sean Packard for his outstanding athletic career and the impact he made at Heritage High School.

Larry Rodriguez

Coach Football



In 1996 Larry was hired as a PE teacher and the first head football coach at Freedom High School.

Lorenzo “Larry” Rodriguez is one of few to be selected to the Liberty Athletic Hall of Fame and the Pittsburg Football Hall of Fame. Larry attended Pittsburg High School where he played football and baseball. He had an outstanding career at Pittsburg High School. His athletic and coaching accomplishments there were: All-League his junior and senior year, All East Bay and All Northern Cal, Selected to play in two All-Star Games, North/South Shrine and Contra Costa, DVAL 1 st team in baseball; Outstanding coaching career at Pittsburg High School as Head Football coach from 1978-1990: DVAL champions 1980, “84” (Tri.), and “85” (Co.) and NCS Champions 1980 and 85. Selected in 2000 to Pittsburg Football Hall of Fame as a player

Larry attended Idaho State University on a football scholarship. He played four years at Idaho and started three of those years. During his junior and senior year he was selected to the All-Big Sky team as outside linebacker. Larry graduated with a Bachelor degree in Physical Education and a Master’s Degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation at St. Mary’s College.

After his collegiate career Larry was hired by Pittsburg High School. He spent 22 years there as a teacher and coach. Prior to being named as head coach of Freedom High School, Larry coached at Los Medanos College for five seasons (91-95) where he met Dennis Henderson, who was the first athletic director for Freedom. Dennis encouraged Larry to apply for the head football position and the rest is history. In 1996 Larry was hired as a P.E. teacher and the first head football coach at Freedom High School

While at Liberty Union High School District Larry had many accomplishments including: First Head Football Coach at Freedom High School; 1998: Fielded first Freedom team with 26 players, beat Mt. Diablo for its first varsity victory in school history; 1999: 6-4 record, beat Liberty, Alhambra, (league champions), missed the NCS playoffs by one game; 2000 moved into BVAL, beat Liberty; 2001 6-4 record, beat Castro Valley, Dublin, Monte Vista, and Liberty in the last game of the season to make the NCS playoffs. Larry also served as Athletic Director at Freedom High School (2000-2003), Assistant Principal at Freedom High School (2002-2006), and volunteered his time to the Freedom football program (2008-2011). He also was very involved in the community with East County Lions football and the youth program, serves on the National Football Foundation scholarship selection committee, and serves as a board member on the Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame

Because of Larry’s leadership skills, in 2006 he was hired as principal at La Paloma High School, and served in that position until his retirement in 2011. His wife, Elizabeth, is a teacher at Freedom High School, and his three daughters and three sons all followed in his footsteps as student-athletes while in high school. The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct Lorenzo “Larry” Rodriguez to the Liberty Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding coaching and leadership at Freedom High School.

J.T. Sarmiento

Swimming ~ Water Polo

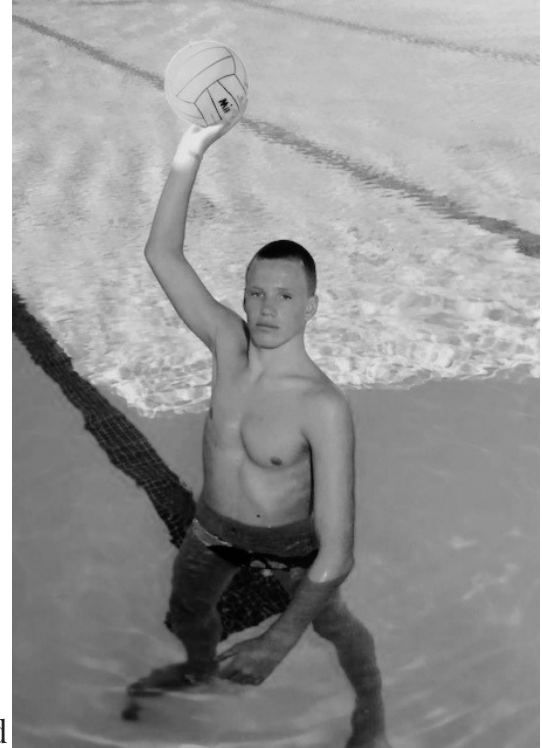
J.T. entered Liberty High School in 2008 and became an immediate standout water polo player. He earned his first of 4 Varsity Letters for water polo that year. His water polo skills continued to improve as he devoted his summers to playing water polo. This dedication to the sport he loved paid off by being named 1st Team All-League BVAL his sophomore, junior, and senior years. He was also chosen as the BVAL Most Valuable Player his junior and senior years. His team mates recognized his leadership abilities and voted him as their team captain in his senior year. During J.T.'s high school career, he scored 262 goals and had 194 steals. He was also an integral part of the Lions qualifying for NCS in his junior and senior years.

J.T.'s expertise in the water was not reserved just for water polo. He also competed and earned his Varsity Letter in swimming as a freshman. In fact, J.T. earned his Varsity Letter in swimming all four years. He was 3rd Team All BVAL as a freshman and a North Coast Section relay qualifier. His sophomore year he was voted Team Captain, earned 2nd Team All BVAL status and qualified for NCS both as a relay team member and as an individual qualifier in the 200 Freestyle. As a junior, J.T. once again earned 2nd Team All BVAL honors and became the Lions top freestyler. He qualified for NCS in the 100 Butterfly and the 50, 100, 200, and 500 freestyles. He chose to swim the 100 Butterfly and the 200 Freestyle at NCS.

J.T. topped off his swimming career at Liberty High School by being named the BVAL Most Valuable Swimmer. He once again qualified as an individual NCS swimmer in all four freestyle events and the butterfly, and was a finalist in the 100 and 200 freestyles.

Besides being an incredible athlete, J.T. earned academic honors all four years. He was recruited by colleges for both water polo and swimming. He chose to attend and play water polo for University of the Pacific in Stockton. While there he earned his Varsity Letter all four years. He helped his team make it to the NCAA D1 runner-up position in 2013. He was recognized as the UOP Defensive Player of the Year in 2014. He also was named a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Academic Team three times and the All-Academic Collegiate Water Polo Association All-Academic Team four times. J.T. graduated from UOP in 2016 where he earned a degree in Business Administration.

The Liberty Union High School District is proud and honored to induct J.T. Sarmiento into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding athletic careers at Liberty Union High School and University of the Pacific.

1997 Liberty Softball Team

Throughout the history of Liberty High School's girls' athletics, the softball program has had tremendous success and produced many outstanding teams and athletes. The 1997 Varsity Softball Team had an extraordinary season that ranks among the very best in Liberty High School history. Coached by Rich Barrios and Bill Silva, the Lady Lions peaked at the end of the season to win the North Coast Section 3A championship. After losing to Pinole Valley High School in the Bay Valley Athletic League title game in a very close contest, the Lady Lions turned the tables on the Spartans and beat them soundly, 8-1, in the NCS championship game. The Lions ended the season with a 21-6 record. They entered the NCS tournament at the No.4 seed and blanked Rancho Cotate 7-0 in the first round and routed Newark Memorial 9-2 in the quarterfinals. Liberty then pulled off a huge upset with a 1-0 victory over the No.1 seed, James Logan High. That win set up the title game against the No.2 seed Pinole Valley.

The Pinole Valley coach Brian Cavali said, "There's no doubt they are the best team right now. They're just a buzz saw. They took it to us." Liberty's Lady Lions definitely peaked at the right time!
