COMMUNITY

Heritage High School is located in Brentwood, California, approximately fifty miles east of San Francisco. Heritage High School, the third comprehensive high school in the Liberty Union High School District, opened on August 1, 2005. Brentwood's population is approximately 70,000. Brentwood, which was once considered a rural town, has become a suburban city, while retaining its agricultural roots.

TOTAL ENROLLMENT

The current enrollment of Heritage High is 2563 with 37.5% Caucasian, 25.9% Hispanic, 14% African American, 17% Asian, 11.0% Filipino, 0.1% Pacific Islander, 0.3% American Indian/Alaskan Native. 16% of student population are identified as socioeconomically disadvantaged. 3.4% are English language learners.

ACCREDITED BY: A 6 year accreditation with no review, the highest review possible, has been granted by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

STAFF:

The Heritage High School staff consists of a principal, 5 assistant principals, 4 counselors, 1 targeted counselor, 1 social-emotional counselor, 2 school psychologists, 1 speech therapist, 1 district librarian, 2 psychologist intern and 114 certificated teachers. The professional staff is supported by 88 full-time and part-time classified staff.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Heritage High School meets the diverse needs of students through its regular and special programs. Special programs include: Advanced Placement courses, Career Technical Education Courses, Special Education, Air Force JROTC, and 4 distinct academies which include Technology, Art and Entrepreneurial, Health, and Public Services.

25.2% of Heritage students were enrolled in at least one AP course in 2023-24. 80% received passing scores of 3 or higher.
