UC/CSU College Entrance Requirements A- G Requirements

Subjects	Min. Requirements of College Preparatory Courses	
A. History/Social Science	2 years: World History, U.S. History, Government	
B. English	4 years: College Prep English 9-12	
C. Math	3 Years of college prep math, 4 years is highly recommended Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II	
D. Laboratory Science	2 years of lab science. 3 years of lab science is recommended: Living Earth, Chemistry, Physics (Example)	
E. Language other than English	2 years of the same language, 3 years is recommended Spanish, French	
F. Visual/Performing Arts	1 year of a college prep course Art, Music, Theater	
G. College Preparatory Elective	1 year of a college prep elective Psychology, Speech and Debate, Creative Writing, etc.	
Test Requirements	SAT or ACT not needed for admission



PRACTICE TEST:

PSAT – Practice SAT (11th Grade, Fall) PSAT 10 – Practice SAT (10th Grade, Spring)

ACTUAL TEST:

SAT – Critical Reading, Essay and Math (Spring of 11th Grade) **OR** ACT – Reading, Essay, Math and Science (Spring of 11th Grade) *May help with English and Math placement at 4-year University

CAASP Tests: California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress Why is it important?



The CSU will use the highest achieved measure to determine placement appropriate GE English or Math courses.

CASSP provides an early indicator of student's readiness to take GE English and Math Courses.

The CAASP scores are included in the CAASP Student Score Report the school district provides to students in the fall of the senior year.

Prioritizing student mental health can have a transformative effect on academic achievement, and it is embedded as part of our SEL practices.





2nd Semester Numbers Student Visit Breakdown




