General Process for Academic Course Placement

- Assessment of *quantitative* data from multiple assessments
- *Qualitative* conversations between High School Department Chairs, Middle School Team Leaders, and Grade 8 teachers
- Recommendations for levels to grade 8 parents during March for review, confirmation, and conversation
- Movement towards differentiation via course leveling
 College Prep, Advanced College Prep, Honors





Scheduling Timeline

- May: Course recommendations and verification of selected electives will be communicated home.
- June: Families will be contacted by THS counselor if unresolvable course conflicts exist.
- August: Schedules will be released to students prior to the start of school via the parent portal.
