# BARTLETT HIGH SCHOOL 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE REGISTRATION

### INTRODUCTION/PRE-INFORMATION

- Course Registration for 10<sup>th</sup> Grade
- Three Types of Classes: Standard, Honors, and Advanced Placement (AP)
- Honors/AP = Recommended 90 or above current Y1 avg. & Honors contract.
- All students with the last name "A-K" should contact Mrs. Isaac only, regarding any course registration questions.
- All students with the last name "L-Z" should contact Ms. Sumlar only, regarding any course registration questions.
- \*\*You may make changes to your schedule in PowerSchool until March 23<sup>rd</sup>.\*\*
- March 24<sup>th</sup> May 22<sup>nd</sup> PowerSchool will be locked; therefore, you will need to email your designated counselor to request a change to your course requests.
- No schedule changes will be made after May 22<sup>nd</sup>!

#### PRE-INFORMATION

- You must choose 3 alternate classes to replace any holes/blanks in your schedule.
- If you do not choose 3 alternate classes, Ms. Ross (10<sup>th</sup> gr. counselor) will choose those classes for you if you need an additional class next year.
- Key sections on the 10<sup>th</sup> Grade Course Card:
  - + = Honors or AP Contract is required for these classes.
  - # = Application or Audition is required for these classes.
  - SEM = semester class (1/2 year course), so you will need two sem. classes to have a full yr. class for the school year.

ACT/SAT Exam:	must take at least once by February of the Senior Year

#### **ENGLISH**

- English 10 (Standard)
- English 10 Honors (Recommended 90 or above Y1 avg. & a Honors contract)
- Pre-AP English 10 Honors (Recommended 90 or above Y1 avg. & a Honors contract)
- You must pass English each year to be promoted to the next grade level.
- If you do not pass the full year of English 9, you will need to register for summer school.

#### **MATH**

- Algebra 1A → Algebra 1B
  - (Ms. TerBurgh's 6<sup>th</sup> per. class ONLY)
- Algebra Geometry (standard or Honors)
- Geometry → Algebra II (standard or Honors)
  - (Ms. Deter's 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, & 6<sup>th</sup> per. classes)
- Honors (Recommended 90 or above Y1 avg. & a Honors contract)
- If you do not pass the full year of Math, you will need to register for summer school.

#### SCIENCE

- Physical Science → Biology IA (If you are currently taking Ms. Spohn's 6<sup>th</sup> per. Algebra IA class, you will take Biology IA)
- Physical Science → Biology I (standard or Honors)
- Biology I -> Chemistry I (standard or Honors)
  (Ms. Parker's Classes)
- Honors (Recommended 90 or above Y1 avg. & a Honors contract)
- Students are required to take 3 Science credits for graduation.

#### **SOCIAL STUDIES**

- If you did not take World History & Geography during 9<sup>th</sup> grade; then you must take World History & Geography during your Sophomore year. Your options are:
  - Standard or Honors
- If you are currently taking World History & Geography Standard or Honors; then your options are:
  - No History for 10<sup>th</sup> Grade (Opt. out of a history for your Sophomore year, and take an alternate course, or study hall in place of your history class)
  - US History Honors (if you plan to take AP US History...APUSH as a Junior, you must take
    US History Honors as a Sophomore)
  - AP Human Geography (an addt'l history for 10th gr., if you already took W.H. &
    Geography, and you still want to take a history class for your Sophomore year)
  - Honors/AP (Recommended 90 or above Y1 avg. & a Honors contract)
  - 3 credits of Social Studies are required for graduation.
  - If you are not currently taking World History & Geography you must sign up to take it as a Sophomore.

#### P.E. & WELLNESS

- 1.5 credits of Wellness and P.E. are REQUIRED to graduate:
- Wellness and P.E. are not the same class!!!
  - 1cr. =Lifetime Wellness (year long class)
  - .5cr. = Rec. Games/.5cr. = Lifetime Sports (1/2 sem. classes)
- If you did not take Lifetime Wellness as a Freshmen, it is recommended that you take it your Sophomore year. If you choose not to take it your Sophomore year, it is still REQUIRED for you to graduate.
- You will also need to take Recreational Games or Lifetime Sports, unless you turn in an Alternate Credit P.E. form, (also called a P.E. Waiver).
- Your Coach or Sponsor will need to complete this form, once you have completed your Sports season (football, basketball, track, etc.), or extracurricular activity (Band, Cheer, or Spring Theatre performance).
- You and your parent will need to sign the form before you email it to the Counselor completing your course registration.
- It is your responsibility to submit this form, to your designated course registration counselor, before the last day of school, which is May 16, 2024.
- Students submitting a P.E. Waiver will be awarded a Grade of "P" for participation and the .5 graduation credit in PowerSchool. However, you will receive no quality points towards your GPA.
- P.E. Waivers can only be submitted for BCS sponsored sports, or extracurricular activities.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE

- 2 credits of the same foreign language are required for graduation.
- If you took Spanish I Honors in 8<sup>th</sup> grade; received a credit for Spanish I Honors, and are currently taking Spanish II standard or Honors, you will complete your two FL credits this year.
- However, you may still take Spanish III (standard or Honors) next year (It is not required, but it is highly recommended).
- If you are currently in the first year of a foreign language you should sign up to take the second year.

So, if you are **CURRENTLY** taking:

- French I (Standard or Honors), French II (Standard or Honors)
- German I (Standard or Honors), German II (Standard or Honors)
- Spanish I (Standard or Honors), Spanish II (Standard or Honors)
- Latin 1 (Standard) is ONLY available at the Main BHS Campus.

\*\*The Main BHS campus does not have <u>1st year</u> Honors level Foreign Language Courses for Spanish I, French I, German I, or Latin I.

#### FINE ARTS

- 1 credit of a fine art is required for graduation.
- If you are not currently taking a fine arts class, you must take one before graduation.

#### **FOCUS AREAS**

#### Students must earn 3 elective credits in 1 main focus area

- Math & Science: (3 credits beyond what is required for graduation credit)
- Coding: (3 credits)
- Cosmetology: (3 credits)
- Criminal Justice: (3 credits)
- Culinary Arts: (3 credits)
- Diagnostics & Therapeutic Services: (Must be enrolled in Biology to take Human A&P) (3 credits)

- Digital Arts & Design: (3 credits)
- Early Childhood Education: (3 credits)
- Human & Social Services: (3 credits)
- Machining Technology: (3 credits)
- Maintenance & Light Repair: (3 credits)
- Marketing, Management, & Entrepreneurship: (3 credits)
- Mechatronics (3 credits)
- STEM Applications: (3 credits)
- Web Design: (3 credits)

#### STUDY HALL

- Study Hall may be taken as a semester (half year course) or full year course.
- You can not have more than 2 semester study hall classes per year.
- You do not receive any graduation credit for study hall.
- You can not request which period you would like to have study hall on your schedule.
