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Dr. Lee Buice Elementary will involve parents in the partnership and development of the Buice Parent and Family Engagement Policy, as well as the process of school review and improvement. A flexible number of parent involvement meetings will be held each year. (2) Meetings will be held in the following settings: Parent/Teacher Conferences, Meet the Teacher/Open House, Curriculum Nights and meet and greets with the administrative staff. During these meetings, parents will be provided with opportunities to formulate suggestions, share experiences with other parents, and participate in decisions relating to the education and behavior of their children. Parents will receive data each quarter to review student progress. The Title I Annual Meeting will provide parents with an explanation of the school curriculum, types of assessment, including MAP, STAAR, and unit tests, and student expectations.

Parents will be provided timely information about school events through e-mail, school planners, phone calls, campus website, campus Facebook page, and the FOCUS Parent Portal text messages, and school marquee. Communication will be provided in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. Communication will be provided in English and Spanish, and other languages as requested.

School performance profiles will be posted on the campus website. Teachers will be available to meet with parents to assist in interpreting their child's assessment results, provide information on how to monitor student's progress and work to improve their child's achievement. Frequent Communication between parents and teachers is important to ensure student success.

Each year, with the assistance of parents, all staff will be educated on the value and utility of contributions of parents/families, and on how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build positive relationships between the parents and the school.
