


Discussion Board Instructions

Finding the discussion board:

Step 1: Log into Turnitin.com as you normally would.


Step 2: Click the Discussion tab at the top of the page. The location is depicted in the image below.

Step 3: Select the discussion in which you would like to participate.





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
Making posts

Step 1: At the top of the discussion board, select “Reply to this topic.”

Step 2: Type your post.



Step 3: When you are done, simply hit submit!


Replying to posts

Step 1: Find a post to which you would like to reply and select “Reply”.
