Lauren Conder

Athlete Golf



Lauren is a
4 time team MVP,
4 time All-BVAL 1st team,
2 time BVAL MVP and
3 time BVAL champion.

From the moment that Lauren Conder set foot on the Heritage campus, she began to make an impact on the work ethic and expectations that future Patriots would strive for. With golf being a Fall sport, it didn't take long for Lauren's impact to be felt. She lettered in her freshman year and then each year after that for a total of 4 Varsity Letters in golf.

But that was only the beginning of a long list of accolades that she would both earn and receive. She was a 4 time team MVP, 4 time All-BVAL 1st team, 2 time BVAL MVP (2008, 2009), as well as being a 3 time BVAL Champion (2007, 2008, 2009). She was also the first girl to qualify for NCS in school history and went on to qualify each of her 4 years! In her senior season she became the school's first Nor Cal representative by finishing 3rd at the North Coast Section Championships. Top that off with being a 4 time NCS Scholar athlete and you have one of the most well rounded student-athletes in school history.

Away from school, Lauren was very active in the game by her involvement with the First Tee Foundation. She was part of their Leadership Academy and Future Leaders Forum and was the recipient of the Patty Sheehan Award that recognizes outstanding leadership and golfing ability. She also received the Monterey Peninsula Foundation Award and was part of the PGA's AT&T Pebble Beach First Tee Tournament.

After graduating from Heritage, Lauren went on to compete collegiately at Richmond University. As a member of the Spiders, she competed for 4 years and earned many accolades. She has the 2nd all-time best single season scoring average in school history, and the 3rd all-time overall average as well! She competed in 33 of 36 possible collegiate events and was 2nd team all-conference her senior year. She had 7 career top 10 finishes, and 14 top 2 finishes.

Currently, Lauren lives in Florida and previously worked as Assistant Producer at the Golf Channel and is currently a Revenue Associate at Golf Now.

Art Honegger

Athlete Football ~ Rugby

Art was an outstanding all-around athlete at Liberty High School from 1938 to 1941. He played and earned two varsity letters in basketball and two in track, but it was football that became his main forte. He earned three varsity letters and was selected as the MVP on the 1941 team. He even found time to letter in "B" baseball in his frosh year.


Upon graduation from Liberty, Art attended the University of California in Berkeley where he had an outstanding career in football. As a sophomore, he was chosen on Esquire Magazine's National Sophomore Team as Number 7. That season he scored the winning touchdown against Stanford.

Art went on to play two years of varsity football winning two Big "C" letters. He was a standout on the varsity team for two seasons – 1942 and 1943. He was selected to the 1943 All-Coast Football Team. Art was Cal's Captain and was selected to receive the "Golden Bear Award" presented annually to the Bear's Most Valuable Player. It is selected by the varsity team members only. After football, Art found another sport that he loved – Rugby. He was not just good – he was great! He set the Rugby scoring record at Cal that lasted from 1944 to 1950.

Art graduated from UC and was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the US Marine Corps. While Art was in the Marine Corps, he played football at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and at Camp Pendleton in California. During the war years these military teams were packed with college All–Star athletes – it was a very high caliber of football. Art was such an outstanding football player that he was drafted in the 12th round by the Chicago Bears.

Art was not only a fine athlete; he was an outstanding citizen in his community upon his return from the military. He served on many Boards, such as: the Delta Memorial Hospital, the Oakley Fire District, and the East Contra Costa Irrigation District. He served on the Oakley Union School District Trustees from 1948 to 1961. He was a Liberty Union High School District Trustee for 12 years. He also served as Foreman of the Contra Costa County Grand Jury.

The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is honored and proud to induct Art Honegger into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding athletic careers at Liberty Union High School and the University of California and his long dedicated service to the Liberty Union High School District.

David Prado

Athlete Wrestling



David is one of few who have earned the Freedom Athlete of the Year honor with only a single sport participation.

David Prado was born and raised in Oakley. He started his educational career in the Oakley District and began his athletic career at O'Hara Park Middle School. He came from a proud wrestling family and was determined to set his mark not just as a future legendary Freedom Falcon, but he aspired to become one of the great wrestlers in East Contra Costa County. He graduated from Freedom High School in 2007.

His passion for wrestling was second to none, and he was a four-time varsity letter winner during his high school years. Throughout his wrestling career he received numerous accolades including the 2007 prestigious Martin Olivarri/Clyde Forrest trophy winner, given to the best BVAL wrestler. Few have accomplished the feat of being named Freedom Athlete of the Year with only a single sport participation, but David was dominant in wrestling and the model for all Freedom athletes in his senior 2007 season. During his Freedom career he placed in the top two wrestlers in the BVAL all four seasons of competition. He was in the top three all four years in NCS Championships. He was a two-time CIF State place winner of 4th place in 2006 and 2nd place in 2007.

His talent was so undeniable that he made the top 100 Contra Costa Times Athletes list. Not only was he recognized locally, sectionally, and at the state level, but he was invited to continue his wrestling career at Arizona State University where he was a three-time varsity letter winner and recognized as a scholar athlete from 2010–2012. During his 2009 collegiate season he was the 7th place finisher in the Pac-12 Championships and ranked #25 in the nation. David's legacy continued the proud tradition of wrestling excellence in East County and established him as one of Freedom's finest athletes.

Aimee Rodgers

Athlete Track ~ Volleyball

In 1996, Aimee Rodgers began her path toward athletic greatness when she enrolled in Laurel Elementary. She stayed true to her Oakley foundations and was gifted with extraordinary track ability. Her coaches at Freedom knew she was going to be special; however, they never imagined her path would leave a legacy for future Freedom athletes and lead her to collegiate competition at Chico State University. In her early high school career, she wanted to make the most of her experience and played two years of volleyball and became active in student leadership. In her two years of volleyball competition, she received two awards; Most Inspirational Player and Most Improved.

In student leadership she was the rally commissioner for two years, a member of the homecoming court during her senior year, and was elected ASB Senior Class President all while maintaining honor roll status academically. She was a leader for the Freedom community that left an indelible impact in both athletics and academics.

These accomplishments are astounding for any student, yet it was her achievements in track that make her legendary. The distinguished Bay Valley Athletic League has had many champions, but Aimee was a 7 time BVAL Champion. From 2006–2009, she was nearly unbeatable holding the 100-meter hurdle title. She also won the titles for 300meter hurdles in 2006, 2008, and 2009. She became Freedom's record holder in both events with a 14.47 time in the 100 hurdles and a 44.57 time in the 300. Her accomplishments lead her to the CIF State Track Meet twice and she was the Freedom Track MVP for all four of her high school years in addition to being named team-captain in her final three. Her outstanding high school career lead her to collegiate sports at Chico State University where she was a 5 time NCAAA Division II national provisional qualifier, finishing 12th in the nation in 2011 in the 100-meter hurdles, and in 2012 she finished 13th in the nation in 400meter hurdles. Her leadership and dedication lead to the Chico State team winning the conference championship in all of her years of attendance.



Sam Somerhalder

Athlete Volleyball ~ Water Polo



Sam Somerhalder was selected as First Team All-League 3 times in both volleyball and water polo. Sam Somerhalder was born and raised in Knightsen, California. He was the youngest of three children who was introduced to sports by his parents, Phil and Julie. He started swimming at age three and a-half for the Knightsen Aquaknights. He began his education at Knightsen Elementary School.

Sam attended Liberty High School from 1999 to 2003. He lettered in both Volleyball and Water Polo all four years. Sam was also a member of Block L from 1999 to 2003. In 2003 Sam was the Yearbook Athlete of the Year.

In his four years as a member of the varsity volleyball team, Sam was offensive MVP in 2001. In 2002 and 2003, he was Co-MVP. He was selected first team All-League in 2001, 2002, and 2003. Sam participated in NCS in 2002 and 2003. His highlights in volleyball for the 2003 season were team leader in assists (832); second in kills (158); second in blocks (55); team leader in service points (252); and team leader in ace serves (29). In his four years on the varsity water polo team, Sam was most improved player in 1999. In 2000, he was Offensive MVP. In 2001 and 2002 he was Team MVP. He was selected First Team All-League in 2000, 2001 and 2002. He participated in NCS in 2001 and 2002. Highlights in his water polo career were, top scorer in NCS in 2001 (93) goals, and in 2002 he set a Liberty High School record in goals (125) and steals (72).

After graduating Sam was recruited by Brigham Young University – Hawaii, and played in the 2003 season. After one year at BYU – Hawaii, Sam left to pursue his lifelong dream of followir in his grandfather and father's footsteps of becoming a firefighte Sam enrolled in the fire academy program at LMC. While taking classes at the academy, Sam was the first water polo coach for Heritage High School from 2005–2007. Sam is now serving East Contra Costa County as a firefighter in the East County Fire Protection Service.

Brian Swisher

Athlete Wrestling ~ Football ~ Contributor

Brian Swisher has always been a tremendous competitor. From childhood to his time on the Liberty campus and into his adulthood, Brian has had a strong work ethic and high expectations for himself. His high school coach, Greg Chappel, stated "Brian always was the hardest worker. He has been a great asset to both the Liberty and Heritage wrestling programs and the entire Brentwood community."

Brian graduated from Liberty High School in 1989. He played football for four years. He finished his third-year Liberty High School varsity wrestling career with an overall record of 95-24 and was two-time League Champion! Brian won and placed in numerous tournaments and was a two-time Lou Bronzan Wrestling Tournament champion. Brian took 3rd and 6th in North Coast Section and was a California State wrestling qualifier – placing 6th and 7th.

After graduating from high school in 1989, Brian attended Diablo Valley Junior College where he continued his outstanding wrestling career, and in his first season he placed 6th at the JC State tournament and 8th the following year. Brian attended San Francisco State University from 1990–91, where he wrestled for one season. Brian left college to help with the family business and is the Controller and Chief Financial Officer of Wayne E. Swisher Cement. Though he entered the business world, his time playing high school sports helped him develop his strong work ethic and ability to work with others; and developed his strong character.

In addition, Brian has been the President of Construction Industry Legislation Council as well as, VP and later President of the Board of Directors for American Sub-Contractor Association of California. For seven years he was on the Board of Directors for the Huntington's Disease Society of America. Brian was elected Mayor of Brentwood from 2002-2006. In 2013, he began adding his expertise to the Brentwood Redevelopment Oversight Committee. Brian currently has gone back to college and will be receiving his Bachelor's Degree in Business Management.

Brian and Tara Swisher have four children that have all attended/graduated from Heritage High School since it opened. All four kids have selectively participated in the following sports: volleyball, baseball, football, wrestling, swimming and basketball. Brian's love of wrestling inspired him as an adult to coach and support both the Liberty and the Heritage athletic programs. He has tirelessly supported the schools in this community by donating to all teams as needed: from wrestling mats at Liberty and to other sports as well by building batting cages at Liberty and Heritage and donating equipment for Heritage volleyball and supporting the Freedom golf tournament. Brian was also a tremendous supporter of the "Save Freshman Sports" campaign. Beyond just donating toward athletic programs and athletes, Brian was an integral part of helping to build the Sandie McKillip Memorial at Heritage. Though Brian's musical ability could possibly be suspect, we are not quite sure how he still found the energy to assist the Heritage band with equipment. He is sort of Brentwood's Renaissance Man, if you will.

Athlete Softball ~ Volleyball ~ Basketbal



Kimberly Westlund helped lead Freedom's softball team to four consecutive league championships.

Kimberly Westlund was born and raised in Oakley. She started her education in the Oakley District with the strong foundations of becoming one of our great academic and athletic leaders. Kim was a three-sport athlete participating in volleyball, basketball, and her primary sport, softball.

In basketball, she made an instant impression. Selected to be part of the varsity team her freshmen year, she knew she wanted to make an impact. She anchored the Freedom teams as a point guard and her accolades were rewarded as a BVAL 2nd Team all-league selection her senior year. She was selected team captain during her senior season as her competitive fire made everyone around her want to do better.

She had a passion for Freedom Athletics and participated in every season in her career; however, she was always true to her athletic passion, softball. Like basketball, she was selected to the varsity team during her freshmen season and was rewarded individually with the team awards of Most Inspirational and Rookie of the Year. Collectively with her teammates, they collected a BVAL Championship pennant, the first of four consecutive league championships. In all of her four years of softball competition, she found herself playing in the NCS Championships, and she found victory during her sophomore season. With such an accomplished record, it was little surprise that colleges nationwide wanted her to join their programs. After selecting California State University San Luis Obispo, she played for four years on scholarship while studying to better prepare for a career in media.

In 2010, Kim was recognized as the Freedom Athlete of the Year, the pinnacle award for any Freedom student athlete and academically, she was multiple selection NCS Scholar Athlete and 4-time school Honor Roll selection. She continues to leave her legacy of excellence everywhere she goes and Freedom continues to celebrate her accomplishments as one of Freedom's finest.

2007 Heritage Varsity Softball Team

The 2007 Heritage High School Varsity Softball team turned their inaugural season into an amazing historical event. According to our research, at no time in the history of the NCS or the CIF has any sport won a Section Championship in their first year of varsity competition. It is a great story that transcended Brentwood, or even the BVAL, and made the entire North Coast Section stand up and take notice. Incredibly, the team consisted of no seniors, 1 junior, 10 sophomores, and 4 freshmen. All of whom had no varsity experience prior to the 2007 season.

The team bonded together as the season progressed through the coaching of longtime East County Coaching Legend John Rebstock and his assistants. They finished with an overall record of 21–5, which included 3 hard fought section playoff wins over much more experienced programs. A 3–1 win over Albany, was followed by a 4–0 victory over Campolindo in the semi-finals, and then they completed their run with an exciting 1–0 championship game victory at Cal over Piedmont. Along the way, they ended Freedom High School's 42–game winning streak.

The team was led in the circle by sophomore pitcher Mickell Escobar, who established team and school records that still stand today. She was All-East Bay, All-BVAL, and named the Times Top 100 Athletes. Freshman shortstop Katee Wiley led the young infield, catcher Lauren Townsend was the backbone of the team behind the plate, and Jessica Khalil patrolled the outfield with some acrobatic catches in the playoffs! It was an amazing team effort that took the collective talents of all the girls and the coaches to make it happen.



Inaugural Coach Jack W. Ferrill Service Award


