

Mr. Byer has worked all home games from 1990 to 2016 for the Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams.

Jack Byer was born in Farmington, Arkansas on July 24, 1935. He attended elementary school in Arkansas until moving to Byron, California in 1944, where he continued his education at Excelsior and Byron Elementary. Mr. Byer attended Liberty High School from 1949–1952. After graduating, he worked at a service station in Byron. In 1953, he met his wife, Roberta, and was married in 1956. Mr. Byer joined the U.S. Army and was station in Germany for 2 years. After returning home he and his wife lived in Brentwood where they continue to live. He owned and operated the Shell Station and Byer's Car Care in Brentwood and became very active in the community.

His involvement in Rotary enabled him to take part of running the Liberty High School Basketball Banquet and making arrangements for Liberty Student of the month award. He was awarded Rotarian of the Year for his efforts and was also Rotary President for two separate terms.

Mr. Byer was contacted by Frank Stonebarger to help build the press box at Ohmstede Field. Mr. Byer did not hesitate and helped until every last bolt was placed in each bench for the stadium. His dedication to Liberty High School went further as he became involved in the Liberty Boosters. The Liberty Booster's Truck Raffle became so popular that he had to build BBQs to cook all the tri tips on. Mr. and Mrs. Byer have bought a ticket every year for the Truck Raffle since 1979 when it first was established.

Mr. and Mrs. Byer were both very involved in their children's activities, whether watching football, basketball or softball games, helping with band activities, driving students to out of town basketball events and even hosting football team nights at their house.

After his children had graduated from high school, Mr. Byer continued to go to the football games and helped out on the chain gang when they needed someone to fill in. In 1990, he became a permanent fixture on the football field as one of the main chain gang members. Mr. Byer has worked all the home games since 1990–2016 for the Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams. He was so well known by the referees that they even asked the Liberty crew to do an away game when the opposing team's chain gang didn't show up.

Joey Daniels

Athlete Softball

From an early age, Joey Daniels was destined to continue the proud Oakley traditions of softball greatness. She began school at Laurel Elementary and by the time she was on the O'Hara Park Middle School softball team, everyone around her could see her extraordinary poise, confidence, and ability. In her freshman year at Freedom, she was inserted as a varsity starter and won multiple NCS championships during her tenure.

She was not just a standout in athletics, but was also an academic leader on campus, attaining the designation of NCS Scholar in all four of her years at Freedom. Both her academic and athletic accolades lead her to an opportunity to attend University of Wisconsin where she played softball all four years.

In high school, she received numerous athletic accolades. Her first such award came when she was recognized as a Freshmen with the Queen of the Mountain Award, given to the player providing the most impact to her team at the prestigious Concord tournament. By the end of her senior season, she had been recognized by the BVAL as an All-League athlete. Over the next three seasons, she continued to rack up All-League honors before she won the BVAL Co-MVP in her senior season. Also in her senior season, she was invited to attend the Contra Costa Athlete of the Year Awards Banquet as an honoree.

Upon leaving Freedom, she went on to continue a stellar career in softball and academics at the University of Wisconsin majoring in Sociology and African Languages and Literature. In 2006, she was named the Offensive Player of the Year for the Big 10. Not to be outdone, in 2007, she was named as the Defensive Player of the Year for the Big 10. In her final year of collegiate athletics, 2008, she won both the Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year. Her pursuit of excellence stands second to none.



Cameron Gupton

Athlete

Football ~ Basketball ~ Track and Field



Cameron holds Freedom's 3rd place record for career interceptions.

Cameron participated in multiple sports at Freedom High School; 3 years of track and field, 3 years of varsity basketball and 2 years of varsity football. As member of the Track and field team Cameron participated in the 100 meter dash, 4x100 meter relay, long jump and high jump.

During Cameron's football career at Freedom, he received several honors for his outstanding play. In 2007 he was a 1st Team All-BVAL Football player as a defensive back. In 2008, Cameron was also selected 1st Team All-BVAL as a defensive back and running back, 1st All East Bay and 2nd Team All Metro Honorable as a defensive back. Cameron also received individual honors as a member of the Freedom High School football team. In 2007, he was the Team MVP and in 2008 he was awarded the team Most Valuable Defensive Player. Cameron's career stats for 2007 and 2008 on offense include; 295 carries for 1620 rushing yards and 16 TDs, 53 receptions for 642 yards and 3 TDs, 2 pass completion for 72 yards and 1 TD. On defense Cameron had 66 tackles and in the school record book he is 3rd with 8 career interceptions. On offense, he is 6th in single season with 1137 rushing yards, and 7th in career with 1620 total yards rushing.

In Track and Field, Cameron was a North Coast Section Qualifier in the 4x100 meter relay and High Jump in 2006 and 2007. From 2007-2009 he lettered 3 years as a member of the Freedom High School varsity basketball team as a point guard and shooting guard.

Cameron earned a football scholarship to Idaho State University at the end of his high school career for his outstanding play. In 2009 to 2013 he went on to become a 4-year starter as a defensive back and return specialist at Idaho State University. Cameron was awarded the Michael Calley Award for the Most Improved Player in 2013.

After his successful career at Idaho State University, Cameron went on to play professional arena football for the Amarillo Venom in the Champions Indoor Football League as a defensive back in 2015, and professional American Football for the Turku Trojans in Turku, Finland as a defensive back and return specialist in 2016.

Jordan Knox

Athlete Basketball

Jordan Knox was a true (Columbia) blue basketball player. His impact on the Boys program at Heritage was felt from the very beginning of his freshman year, and he was able to see the fruits of the foundation he helped build during his Junior and Senior seasons.

As a freshman, Jordan made the JV Basketball team. Since this was Heritage's first school year, there was no varsity program. He was the starting guard on that team and helped them to a 16-10 record as they laid the foundation for what was to come.

During his sophomore year and first varsity campaign, Jordan was again a starting guard and this time the team's leading scorer at 12.5 points/game, as well as the leader in assists and steals. In December of that year the boys started to come together at the Varsity level as evidence by winning the Championship of the Bear Creek Shootout, defeating 3 tough Sac-Joaquin Section teams. Jordan was instrumental in that tournament and was named to the All-Tournament team. At the conclusion of the season he was named to the BVAL All-League 1st Team.

During his junior year, the team found their true identity, with him as one of their leaders. The Patriots finished the season with a record of 20–7, were the #2 seed in the NCS Division II playoffs, and won 2 tournament titles. Those included the McKinleyville Tip–Off Tournament, where he was named to the All–Tournament team and the Don Nelson Classic at Dublin High school were Jordan was the MVP. He finished the season as the team leader in scoring (12.4 Points/game), assists, and steals for the 2nd consecutive year, and was again named to the BVAL All–League 1st team.

As if he hadn't done enough, Jordan made his senior year his finest. The team finished with a 19-9 record and reached the NCS Division II semifinals before bowing out to Hayward. He again led his team in scoring (15.6 points/game) and in steals with 70. He was All-Tournament at the Don Nelson Classic, and was named 1st Team All-BVAL for the 3rd consecutive year. The only player in school history to have achieved that. He finished his career as the All-Time Leader in points scored, assists, steals, and rebounds. He left quite a legacy!

Academically, Jordan maintained a high standard of excellence. He was named to the school Honor Roll each year, and was a North Coast Section Scholar Athlete. As his crowning glory at Heritage, he was named the 2009 Heritage High School Male Athlete of the Year.

After his graduation, Jordan continued his Basketball career at The Academy of Arts University in San Francisco, Las Positas College in Livermore, and then fulfilled his dream of playing Division I College Basketball at Cal-State Fullerton. In his final collegiate game, he found himself as the starting guard in the Big West Tournament against Long Beach St, where he set his career high in scoring. It was tremendous way to end a great basketball career.

He graduated from Cal-State Fullerton with a degree in Communications and a minor in Entrepreneurship which is serving him well as the Co-Founder and head of sales for his startup company Butter.ai that helps those that are building the modern world find a way to get information at work no matter the tools you use on a daily basis.



Keaton Lynn

Athlete Water Polo ~ Swimming ~ Volleyball



Keaton was named the Jack Ferrill Athlete of the Year in his senior year. Keaton Lynn has been one of the strongest leaders in Freedom's Water Polo program. He started his educational career in the Oakley District and began his athletic career at O'Hara Park Middle School playing basketball. He came from a proud athletic family and was determined to set his mark as a student who never let obstacles deter him from pursuing his dreams to their fullest extent. In an era that many students chose to focus on one sport, Keaton chose to make the most of his opportunities. He was one of the rare students where high school athletics wasn't enough as he found time to even get his Black Belt in Taekwondo outside of school! At Freedom, he participated in 10 athletic seasons, earning him the Iron Falcon award.

At Freedom, he began his career with Water Polo, being named the JV team captain and was recognized as a NCS Scholar Athlete. He continued his career the very next season with Freshmen Basketball, earning recognition as the Most Improved Player. Right after his basketball season, he dove into the pool and was named to the varsity swim team. During his sophomore year, he earned a varsity letter in all of his sports. In his junior year, he was named captain and MVP of the Freedom Water Polo team and was a first team BVAL all-league award winner.

During Keaton's senior year he found unprecedented success as a team captain, Freedom MVP, BVAL MVP, NCS Scholar Athlete, 1st Team All-League in various tournaments, and was named to the All East Bay All Star Team in Water Polo.

In keeping with his adventurous spirit to maximize his potential, he competed in 2 sports simultaneously during his final quarter at Freedom, lettering in both swimming and volleyball. By the time he had finished his career at Freedom, he was named the Jack Ferrill Athlete of the Year and had secured a spot on the University of Redlands Water Polo team.

If there is one particular element that has remained constant in his life it is his desire to make the most of his opportunities and empower others. Once he finished his collegiate career, he entered the US Navy where he still continues to serve.

Joshua Melgoza

Athlete Soccer ~ Baseball ~ Football

Joshua Melgoza attended Liberty High School from 1995 to 1999 and was a graduate the last year of the century. During those four years, Josh was an outstanding athlete, leader, and scholar.


As a freshman in 1995–1996, Josh lettered in Frosh Football, J.V. Soccer, and J.V. Baseball, where he scored touchdowns, goals, and hits for a high average. In his sophomore year he was a varsity soccer starting forward and played second base on the J.V. baseball team. In his junior year he lettered in varsity soccer and baseball.

Josh blossomed into an all-around athlete by playing three varsity sports in his senior year. In varsity football he was a kicker and wide receiver as he scored enough points to place third on the team. He kicked a 42-yard field goal in one game. On the varsity soccer team he was a starting forward and scored 11 goals and was sixth in the BVAL (Bay Valley Athletic League) in assists. In the spring he was the starting second baseman on the varsity baseball team where he maintained a .333 batting average.

Many honors were bestowed on Josh during his high school career. In 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 he was a BVAL soccer second team selection, and in 1998-1999 he was selected on the All-League first team. He was honorable mention in both BVAL football and baseball. He was picked as the soccer MVP for his senior year and made several all-tournament teams.

We seldom see three-sport athletes at varsity levels, yet Josh showed his all-around talent in soccer, baseball, and football. Josh graduated from Cal State East Bay with a degree in psychology and now works as a community social worker.

Erica Pantle

Coach Swimming



In 2014, Erica was honored as the NCS Honor Coach for swimming. Erica Pantle was raised right here in the area. Her family moved to Brentwood when she was a toddler and then to Oakley when she was 5 years old. She attended Oakley Elementary School and Liberty High School. As a young girl she was very athletic and followed her Dad, long-time Liberty High School track coaching icon and LUHSD Liberty Hall of Fame Member, Keith Dawson into coaching at Liberty High School.

Her coaching career began in Brentwood, coaching the Dolphin Swim Club in 1989. She then moved onto assisting with USA year-round teams Delta Waves and Terrapins. In 1993 Erica stepped on the pool deck at Liberty High School as an assistant swim coach. She took over as Head Coach in 1995 and continued until 2010. In that 18 year career, she coached both boys and girls JV and Varsity teams. During her coaching career, the Varsity boys won 105 out of 150 meets. The Varsity girls' record was an outstanding 128 wins out of 150 meets. The Varsity girls were BVAL champions in 2003 and then again in 2006. The North Coast Section honored Erica in 2014 as the NCS Honor Coach for swimming.

When asked about her coaching philosophy, this is what Erica said: "I feel that coaching is about motivating athletes in a positive way to perform to the best of their abilities. The journey of accomplishing personal goals is what helps set athletes up for success, not just in the athletic arena, but in school and in their future endeavors. The lessons coaches are responsible for teaching athletes go beyond the basic techniques of the sport. They should be life lessons that create a sense of community within each athlete. These lessons should include sportsmanship, team work, work ethic, cooperation, communication, and respect. I always tried to lead by example, setting high expectations for myself and my athletes. I wanted to be a positive role model for my athletes. My greatest successes as a coach did not come with winning records; they came when athletes loved the sport so much, they continued to participate in swimming after they graduated, in college and beyond, as master's swimmers, and some even as coaches themselves."

During the time that Erica was coaching swimming at Liberty, she returned to Cal State East Bay where she graduated with honors. She continued her education at Chapman University earning a teaching credential and later a Master's Degree in Elementary Literacy. She started teaching at Brentwood Union School District in 1995 where she continues currently as an Instructional Coach, working with teachers and students to become the best they can be.

Erica is married to Roy Pantle and has two children, Carl, an accomplished musician, and Haley Pantle Young, a PE teacher and swim coach. She also has three grandchildren, Tatum, Tanner, and Reese Pantle. Erica can still be found on the pool deck one night a week at the local athletic club where she helps master swimmers.

Periodically, the baseball team would make an appearance in the North Coast Section playoffs; however, it was in the 2009 season, the Freedom team of destiny, the BVAL Champions, went on to a historical run to not only make the NCS Championships, but defeat the legendary De La Salle Spartans at the Oakland Coliseum to become the first North Coast Section Baseball Championship team, the first in the history of the school.

Lead by Coach Gary Alexander and Assistant Coach John Maniz, the records for the team are the records of excellence. BVAL Champion...NCS Champion...National Ranking of 26...California Ranking of 6...a 14-1 league record...and a 23-4 overall record.
