


1952 Liberty Swim Team

Coached by: Jack Ferrill

The first year of competitive swimming at Liberty High was in 1952. Up until that time, swimming was an intramural program that did not compete against other schools. Enter a young Marine veteran and recent graduate of College of the Pacific named Jack Ferrill, who was hired that year at Liberty High School to teach Physical Education and coach.

Coach Ferrill established the foundation of a swim program that would have great success over the next few years. The 1952 tied Livermore High School for the Co-Championship that season, and with a large nucleus of the same athletes, went on to win the league meet the following year, upsetting the favored Livermore team at their own pool. It is recalled that Livermore was so unhappy with the loss that their coach was dismissed that same day!

In describing this team, Coach Ferrill states that "I truly loved each and every one of my swimmers because they overcame many obstacles, yet found a way to win. They trained every day in an unheated pool, but they never let themselves quit – they seemed to work even harder." It is because of their work ethic, character, and competitive success that the Liberty Union High School District takes great pride in inducting this team into its Athletic Hall of Fame.

David Biddle & Charlie Dickinson Contributors

The Liberty Union High School District has, throughout the years, been fortunate to have had the support of countless families and individuals who have given freely of their time and resources for the betterment of our athletic programs. In the mid 1970's, a bond was formed between two such families – the Biddles and Dickinsons – which led to forming the foundation of the Liberty HS Athletic Booster Club.

The Biddle and Dickinson boys played on the same teams during several years (1974–1981), and Dave Biddle and Charlie Dickinson enjoyed each other's company at the many contests that their boys participated in, and as fathers enjoyed talking to one another, particularly about anything pertaining to Liberty sports.

One thing that both Dave and Charlie noticed while traveling to other schools for games was that there was , more often than not, a "Booster Club" present that supported their school's sport teams through operating snack bars the sale of school related items such shirts, jackets, emblems, and hats. After a year or so of looking at others, Dave and Charlie asked why doesn't Liberty have a booster club? They approached Principal Lou Bronzan, who was supportive of the idea, and after discussing the matter with the school board members, the Liberty High School Booster Club was created in 1976.

Dave and Charlie put together a small towable trailer that would be the "Liberty Booster Shack" used primarily at home football games, and went about learning the "booster business". There were many volunteers in the beginning that helped Dave and Charlie with the Liberty High Booster Club, and they were very pleased and proud of the overwhelming reception and support given by the Liberty community.

Dave and Charlie set a standard that that has lasted until this day. The Liberty High School Booster Club has been in existence for 42 years and counting, and has raised approximately \$2.1 million dollars. They continue to have a "Truck Raffle" every year, which has brought in the most money, and sell merchandise and concessions at home events. They also sponsor a scholarship that is given each year to deserving student athletes.

It is with great honor and gratitude that the Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame inducts Dave Biddle and Charlie Dickinson for the tireless effort and time that they have given in establishing a booster organization that has benefited the athletic programs at Liberty High School for the past 5 decades.



Mark Biddle Athlete Baseball ~ Football



Mark's last two years at Liberty were outstanding as he developed into one of the best athletes in the area. Mark Biddle attended Liberty Union High School from 1976 through 1979. During those four years, Mark was an outstanding two-sport athlete, scholar and respected leader on campus. During his 9th grade year, Mark was a wide-receiver on the Frosh Football team and played pitcher and shortstop on the Frosh Baseball team. As he entered his 10th grade year, he began to grow and mature into a valuable member of the JV Baseball and Football teams. He was a key pitcher/outfielder on a championship JV Baseball team and started to train as a quarterback in football.

Mark's last two years at Liberty were outstanding as he developed into one of best athletes in the area. As an 11th grader he led the Varsity Baseball team to a league championship as an All-League 1st Team pitcher. He compiled an 8-2 record with a 1.49 ERA. One of Mark's losses was a 1-0 loss to Alhambra High in a play-off game.

During Mark's senior year, he quarterbacked the Varsity Football team to a 5-4 record and 2nd place in the league. He was selected as a co-captain on the team and earned Honorable Mention All-League, as well as being selected as a Brentwood News Athlete of the Week. Mark's last year for the Lion Baseball team was phenomenal. He led the team to a 13-6 record and 2nd place in the league. He recorded a 9-2 pitching record with a 1.15 ERA with 79 innings pitched. He had 68 strikeouts with 16 walks and 7 complete games. Mark was awarded 1st Team All-League, the Parker Robb Super Sport MVP of the League, MVP of the Lion team and 2nd Team All-East Bay.

The highlight for Mark's baseball career as a Lion hurler was throwing a 7 inning, no-hitter against Pittsburg High with 13 strikeouts, although the game ended in a o-o tie after 9 innings. Also, he and Miles McCauley combined to throw a no-hitter against Alhambra High in the championship game of the 1979 Alhambra Easter Baseball Tournament in which the Lions won 9-o.

After graduation Mark pitched for Los Medanos College and played in the 1980 Community College Baseball Championships. He went on to earn a business degree from Heald's Business College and works as the Chief Estimator for Concord Iron Works.

Richard "Rich" Cabral Athlete Football ~ Basketball ~ Baseball

Rick Cabral was called "an athlete for all seasons", a rarity among his peers. In 1980 350 boys played high school sports in the area, only three played at the varsity level in three sports. Rich was one of those. During his high school years, 1977–1981, Rich played football, basketball, and baseball at all three levels of competition. He even tried to run track his freshman year while playing baseball.

Rich is a competitor, a leader, and has a great desire to win. In football he was a quarterback, in basketball a point guard, and in baseball a pitcher and centerfielder that always looked for a way to win. He was the quarterback of the 1977 Foothill Athletic League (FAL) Freshman Football Co-Championship team and the 1979 FAL Varsity Co- Championship team. He was a member of the 1978-79 FAL JV Championship Basketball team, and member of the Varsity Basketball team that won the 1979-80 FAL Championship.

Liberty football coach Mark Watson described Rich as "intelligent, knowledgeable, great feel for the game; he has a good arm, a good touch. He throws different types of passes and is quick on his feet. He's a great ball handler, and his work ethic led our team to a championship season"


Baseball coach Jerry Black said, "Rich was a competitor and leader that enjoyed the game of baseball but knew when to get serious. He was an excellent pitcher and centerfielder with a strong arm and outstanding speed. He was valuable to the team in both positions, motivating his team and enjoying the game."

During his years at Liberty High School, Rich won many awards. He was named the Most Improved Player for the varsity baseball team his junior year. His senior year, he was named Team Captain and won the Outstanding Back Award in football. He was named Honorable Mention All-FAL his junior year in both football and baseball. In his senior year, he was named 1st team All-FAL in football, and 2nd team All-FAL in baseball. He was a winner of the Parker-Robb Player of the Week in football, and was selected as a quarterback for the 1981 Contra Costa County All-Star Football Game.

After high school, Rich played football for two years at Los Medanos Community College, where he was the starting quarterback. Van Boschetti, who coached Rich at LMC described him as a "very smart and fierce competitive player, his short passing was uncanny in the sense of accuracy. He has a great sense of humor, but knew when to get serious."

Rich has given back to his community as well by sharing his knowledge and love of football by coaching. He was the Head Freshman Football Coach at Liberty H.S. in 1987, and served as an assistant JV coach from 1988–1993. He also coached JV football at Freedom H.S. in 2013–2014.

Craig Carson Coach Swimming



It is said that Craig is the "Guardian" of the sport of swimming. Craig Carson attended California State University, Chico where he swam for two years. His senior year he was the captain of the 1973 NCAA Champion swim team. While there he received his Bachelor of Arts degrees in Physical Education and Psychology and in 2018 Craig was inducted into the Chico State Athletic Hall of Fame.

After college Craig coached and taught at a few schools until he came to East County where he began teaching and was the head swim coach at Antioch in 1979. He was successful there and finished at AHS in 1994. He taught and coached at Deer Valley for eight years, took a break, and then came to Heritage High School in 2007. He then again was asked to coach by former Heritage Athletic Director, Pat Cruickshank, who had this to say about Craig, "He transformed the Heritage swim program overnight! Took it from an afterthought of a program and won the 2009 Boys Championship in his first year, then went on to win nine more boys and eight girls titles consecutively. Craig is one of the best coaches, mentors, people I have ever met! Did it the right way for all the right reasons."

Championship teams continued for Heritage boys and girls swimming from 2010 through 2017. Craig was the BVAL swim meet director from 2008–2016. He was honored in 2012 as BVAL Coach of the Year for his Leadership, Integrity and Professionalism. He sat on the NCS swimming committee from 1983–1988 and again from 2012–2018. In 2017, he was named the North Coast Section Honor Coach.

Over the years Craig has coached some amazing student-athletes, including 12 individuals and three relays who still are in the NCS top 25 of all time, 57 individuals and five relays with All-American recognition and over 120 league champions. Many of his HHS swimmers continued on to compete at Division 1 colleges. Three of his male swimmers made it all the way to the Olympic trials.

Swimming has been a way of life for Craig and his wife Paulette, owners of Carson Swim School. It is said that Craig is the "Guardian" of the sport of swimming, for the support they show for swimming in the entire area and the importance on making kids safe in and around the pool. At one time all the head swim coaches in the BVAL, except one, had swam for Craig Carson at some point in their own swim career.

With all the success that Craig Carson has been involved in for over forty years, for him it is about the good memories and the family environment that has come with coaching swimming. One of Craig's favorite highlights at Heritage was in 2009 the boys 200 free relay beat Deer Valley for the first time in a SCREAMING THRILLER with Cyrus Blankinship holding off DV's Stanford bound Aaron Wayne which started a string of 10 straight BVAL championships. AD Pat Cruickshank turned to Coach Carson and said "now I know why you do this".

Lindsey Dal Porto Athlete Swimming ~ Water Polo

Lindsey Dal Porto entered Liberty High School in 1999 and became an immediate standout water polo player. She earned her first of 4 Varsity Letters for water polo that year. She also received 2nd Team Bay Valley Athletic League (BVAL) All-League honors as a freshman. Her water polo skills continued to improve as she devoted her summers to playing water polo. This dedication to the sport she loved paid off by being named 1st Team All-League BVAL her sophomore, junior, and senior years. She was also chosen as the Most Valuable Player those years. During Lindsey's tenure at Liberty, she was selected to be part of the Junior Olympic Team for the Golden Bear Club Water Polo. She was recruited for the Northern California Sectional Development Team for USA Water Polo in 2002. Her team mates recognized her leadership abilities and voted her as their Team Captain in 2002.

Lindsey's prowess in the water was not reserved just for water polo. She also competed and earned her Varsity Letter in swimming as a freshman. In fact, Lindsey earned her Varsity Letter in swimming and was a North Coast Section Qualifier all four years. In 2002, she was part of a 200 Freestyle relay team that swam to All American status.

In 2003, Lindsey topped off her prestigious athletic career by being named the Liberty Union High School Female Athlete of the Year.

After graduating from Liberty, Lindsey continued to play water polo at the University of California at Berkeley for one season. She then focused her efforts on the triathlon circuit and was part of the Cal Triathlon Team from 2004 – 2007.

Lindsey has continued staying active by participating in numerous marathons and has completed a Full Ironman competition.

Renae Dudek Gonzalez Athlete Soccer ~ Cross Country ~ Track



Renae's high school career certainly finished with a flourish, but also surpassed expectations in terms of overall excellence. In an era where three-sport athletes began to dwindle, Renae (Dudek) Gonzalez not only competed across all three seasons, but thrived in all of them, etching her name into the record books across all of her pursuits.

While it was clear that Renae was going to excel as a member of the Liberty soccer program from the outset of her high school career, she also made a name for herself in both cross country and track. In fact, as a senior, she was named first-team all-Bay Valley Athletic League for all three sports, which led to her being recognized as one of the Bay Area's Top 100 prep athletes by the Contra Costa Times in 2003. She was a team captain in all three sports, and was also named the team's Most Valuable Player for all three.

Renae's high school career certainly finished with a flourish, but also surpassed expectations in terms of overall excellence. She was a three-year varsity member of the soccer and track teams, while adding cross country to the list as a senior. She captained the soccer team in both her junior and senior seasons, and after finishing third at the BVAL cross country championships in her senior year, was named MVP of the league in both soccer and track.

In her senior year alone, Renae tallied 14 goals and 11 assists on the soccer field, and then broke the existing Liberty school record in the 1600 meters during track season. At the North Coast Section Meet of Champions, she finished fifth in the 1600 meters, missing a berth to the state championships by just one spot. As a junior, she also advanced to the Meet of Champions weekend, but that time was in the 800 meters, displaying her versatility on the track.

After graduating from Liberty, Renae headed to Cal State East Bay, where she started all four years for the Pioneers girls' soccer team. She was named Scholar Athlete of the Year in each of her first three seasons, and was a team captain for her senior year, when she also earned recognition as a defender, named Second-Team All-Independent, as the Pioneers competed outside a conference during her career. And even though she was using her speed and intelligence on the field as a defender, Renae still continued to find ways to score, adding a pair of goals in each of her junior and senior seasons.

As a team captain during the final year of her college career, Renae was able to display the winning qualities which she had shown everyone during her high school years, leading the Pioneers to a 12–5–1 overall record, a mark which still stands as the best season this century on the Hayward campus.

Renae graduated from Cal State East Bay in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology. She has since returned to Brentwood, where she previously owned a popular children's store, Little Miss Everything, and publishes a website called Macaroni Kid, which keeps the Brentwood community informed of events and local businesses.

Larry Enos Sr. Family

Larry Sr., Paulette, Cally, Charley, Larry Jr.

The Larry Enos Family certainly ranks high in the history of the Liberty Union High School District's great athletic tradition. Larry Enos Sr. was an outstanding quarterback on the Lion's football teams of 1966, 1967, and 1968. He was a 1st Team All-League Quarterback in 1967, and he was the Lion's Most Valuable Back. Larry also played on the varsity baseball from 1967 through 1969. He was an outstanding leader in the field of play – he was a coach's dream.

Not to be outdone, Larry's wife Paulette Billingsley was an outstanding athlete as a synchronized swimmer, going on to the Junior Olympics and to the Senior Nationals in 1971. At Cal Poly she played softball and was the Women's Athletic Association Vice-President, and then in 1975 she became the W.A.A President. Paulette also coached the Brentwood Recreation Swim Team for six seasons. She also taught lessons to swim classes and junior and senior lifesaving classes for 23 years. She served as an officer on the Board of the Liberty Athletic Boosters Club for 12 years.

Larry Enos Jr. followed in the footsteps of his parents. He was an outstanding football and baseball player at Liberty. At Los Medanos College, he concentrated on baseball, and he was named to the 1st Team All-Conference at 2nd base. He was the team's Defensive Player of the Year. In his sophomore season he was named to 1st Team All-Conference and was selected All-State and was LMC Sportsman of the Year. At St. Mary's College, he lettered in baseball, batting .305 his junior year and starting at 2nd base. His senior year he batted .315, and a college highlight was hitting a home run against #1 Stanford in their stadium.

Charley Enos played football, basketball, baseball, and he sometimes ran for the track team. He was an outstanding athlete who was also recognized as a Distinguished Scholar. He was named to the Contra Costa Times as one of the "Athletes of the Year" and by the California Legislature as one of the "Top 100 Athletes of the Year." He also qualified for North coast Section honors, and was recognized by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame with the Scholar Athlete Award for Contra Costa County. He was selected to the Contra Costa All-Stars Football team. At U.C. Davis, Charley was chosen to the Div. II All-America Football Team. What an athletic career!

Cally Enos Stock was not to be outdone by her brothers. At Liberty, Cally lettered in volleyball, basketball, softball and swimming. At the University of California at Davis, she played four years of Club Lacrosse and was Captain of her team. In all four years of her high school athletics, she was a Scholar Athlete and in her senior year was selected as a North Coast Section Athlete in volleyball and swimming.

The Liberty Union High School District is blessed to have had this family of outstanding athletes, citizens, and boosters among its alumni. It is with extreme pride that we celebrate their induction into our Athletic Hall of Fame.
