Questions to Consider

Discuss these with your executive director, board of directors, and/or legal counsel:

- 1. What specific policies and procedures do we have in place to protect client information and respond appropriately to immigration enforcement actions?
- 2. Are all staff and volunteers thoroughly trained in our policies regarding the protection of client information?
- 3. Are all staff and volunteers aware of resources to empower immigrants in the community with knowledge about their rights?
- 4. Which individual(s) on the staff and board of directors must be notified if our organization receives a subpoena or an informal request from the government for information?
- 5. Have we reviewed <u>8 USC § 1324</u>, relevant court decisions in our jurisdiction, and any applicable state laws or local ordinances to understand what actions may put our organization at risk?
- 6. Do we need to create additional policies or procedures to protect clients and our organization?
- 7. How will we communicate to clients: (1) our commitment to safeguarding their information and (2) how they can learn more about their rights?
