	roles, summer programs, or opportunities to help you explore your interests.  Explore and learn about various colleges - attend fairs and high school visits.

	Prepare for and take the <b>PSAT/NMSQT in October</b> .  Your PSAT score will help you determine if the SAT or ACT is a better-fit test. You may qualify for the <a href="MMSQT scholarship">NMSQT scholarship</a> .
