Spring - Fall

Early Fall (September-October)
<ul> <li>Make an appointment with Mrs. Campbell for your Senior Meeting.</li> <li>□ October 15-17: Free Colorado Application Days. Visit the College Center.</li> <li>□ Decide how you will apply to each school: Early Decision, Early Action, or Regular Decision.</li> <li>□ Know the essay prompts for each college you apply to and begin drafts.</li> <li>□ Update your Naviance account with "college I'm applying to."</li> <li>□ Begin college applications (Institutional applications or Common Applications).</li> <li>□ Link your Naviance and Common App accounts if using the Common App.</li> <li>□ Advocate for yourself and ask questions.</li> </ul>
Winter/Spring
<ul> <li>Receive and compare college financial aid award packages. Contact colleges with any questions. Ask if there are additional scholarships you can apply for or qualify for.</li> <li>Review all admissions offers. Check your email and college portals frequently.</li> </ul>
May
<ul> <li>May 1<sup>st</sup> is College Decision Day - the day to let your college know you are attending.</li> <li>Wear your college gear on May 1<sup>st</sup> – Let's celebrate! Come to 9<sup>th</sup> hour for Root Beer Floats!</li> <li>Take AP Exams and request AP scores be sent to the college you will attend.</li> <li>Request Final Transcripts.</li> </ul>
ACT/SAT Tests
<ul> <li>Here is a list of colleges that are test optional <a href="www.fairtest.org">www.fairtest.org</a></li> <li>Check with your colleges to determine if and how they use test scores.</li> <li>Plan when you will take the ACT and/or SAT.</li> </ul>
Financial Aid and Scholarships
<ul> <li>Parents and students should be familiar with Federal Financial Aid by reviewing the website in detail.</li> <li>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</li> <li>Prepare tax information to complete the FAFSA.</li> </ul>
☐ The FAFSA is available on December 1 <sup>st</sup> . Be sure to complete it before your college's financial deadline.
☐ Familiarize yourself with the CSS Profile if it is required by any of the colleges you're applying to.

☐ Review the scholarship list with Mrs. Campbell to know which scholarships you qualify for.
