This week we have celebrated children's mental health week and it has been lovely to have parents involved in this too through our Express events and through the messages that parents have left on the boards at the front of school.

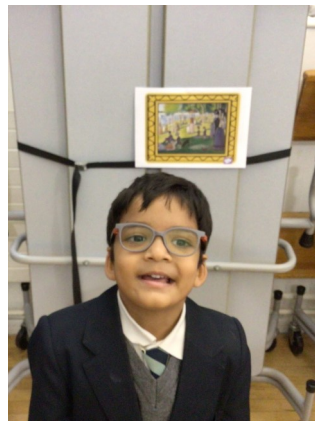

Year 1 are still enjoying Claude in the City! They liked reading about Claude's adventurous trip to the art gallery. The children have been learning all about what art galleries were like and enjoyed looking at some famous paintings, comparing them and thinking about how they could describe them.

Ask me: What was my favourite painting?



Year 2 visited a Mosque as part of our R.E topic. We learnt to write our name in Arabic as well as trying on some traditional clothes and learning more about the Qur'an. We discovered foods that are considered to have healing properties in Islam such as dates and pomegranate and also got to sample these!

Ask me: What did you learn about during your trip to the Mosque?



Year 3 have been thoroughly enjoying learning about their science project this week, forces and magnets. They discussed what a force was and used a force-meter to measure pulls. They also investigated and compared a range of magnets (bar, horseshoe and floating) and explained that magnets have two poles (north and south) and that opposite poles attract each other, while like poles repel each other. In PSHE, they have been planning and designing a garden for people with a disability or special need - considering what they might need and including sensory features.

Ask me: What is a headline?



Year 4 have had a busy week with lots of fun activities. In jigsaw the focus has been team work, winning and losing. The children worked in teams to create a potato character. They had to present their design and vote on a winner. Mrs Harris was very impressed with how well the teams worked with each other and how positive they were to winning and losing. In Geography the children enjoyed the mountain lesson. They tried on midge nets and spent time in a shelter in the playground. They were surprised at how quickly the shelter warmed up and then how cold it felt outside the shelter. In Science the children used thermometers to complete their ice experiments.

Ask me: What items should you pack for a mountain adventure?



Reception have enjoyed listening to a variety of stories and learning how to sing a variety of songs and rhymes to support their project Stories and Rhymes. We have been reading the story of the Gingerbread Man this week and began by making our own biscuits whilst reciting parts of the story. We have been learning the rhymes Horsey, Horsey and I can Sing a Rainbow.
