MISSOURI MILITARY ACADEMY

One of the country's top military college preparatory boarding schools for young men, Missouri Military Academy (MMA) seeks a strong and experienced military leader and role model to help foster self-discipline, personal responsibility and accountability with our middle and high school cadets, guiding them in taking command of their lives. The commandant reports directly to the Academy president.

Displaying exceptional leadership and high energy, he or she must design and deliver programming for positive character, leadership and life skills development that encourages goal setting, academic excellence, honor and integrity, living a healthy lifestyle, and avoiding high-risk behavior.

This position offers a unique opportunity to educate, mentor and inspire young men in a structured environment as they navigate critical stages of personal, physical and academic development to prepare for college and adulthood.



RESPONSIBILITIES AND MANAGEMENT AREAS

A disciplined, goal-oriented leader focused on the positive, whole-person development of young men is needed to ...

- Provide a supportive and orderly environment for learning that encourages self-discipline, personal responsibility, and a highly organized lifestyle.
- Oversee new cadet matriculation, middle school and high school orientation, training, and assimiliation into the Academy's military structured environment.
- Oversee cadet daily activities and quality of life to include: barracks supervision, management of room assignments, coordination of auxiliary services, transportation and the health clinic, community service, ceremonies and special events.
- Develop strong and confident cadet officers through the design and successful implementation of a cadet leadership program, in conjunction with academics, athletics, military and residential life programs.
- Strictly, fairly and consistently enforce MMA rules and standards of military courtesy and bearing and MMA traditions.
- In partnership with the Director of Admissions, serve as the primary cadet retention officer.
- Work closely with the Army JROTC Department and ensure the Academy maintains high standards to retain the Honor Unit with Distinction rating.
- Coordinate military training of the corps with the Senior Army Instructor so that Leadership Education and Training class lessons are applied in corps operations and community service projects.

- Oversee and maintain a culture of fair and consistent discipline and accountability with respect for others.
- Provide and support necessary guidance and/or referral for cadets experiencing disciplinary, academic, physical or mental health issues.
- Oversee the Academy's plan of the day and master calendar and schedule. Plan and direct practices for major events and ceremonies.
- Oversee the management, program of instruction and training of the commandant's division staff to ensure effective supervision and training of cadets.
- Maintain and facilitate communications, building positive rapport between company leadership advisors (CLAs) and academic faculty, parents, alumni and community members.
- · Oversee budgeting process for commandant's division.
- Oversee the planning, coordination and implementation of MMA summer camps and academic academy (with the academic dean) and outside turnkey camps.
 Manage summer camp operations as needed to meet the Academy's standards of performance, financial and enrollment objectives, and American Camp Association requirements.
- Live in provided campus housing with 24/7 responsibilities.
- Accomplish special projects and duties as assigned by the President.





COMMANDANT OF CADETS MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's degree with emphasis preferred in leadership, counseling, human resources, management or education from a regionally accredited institution (extensive work experience, in positions of significant responsibility, in any of these areas with a master's degree in any discipiine is also acceptable)
- Prior miiltary service having attained the rank of LTC/05 or higher with battalion or higher level command experience or its equivalient preferred
- With the requirement to wear a uniform, must be in excellent physical condition, meeting Army height and weight standards
- Must have successfully worked with adolescents and young adults (13 to 23 years of age)

COMPENSATION
