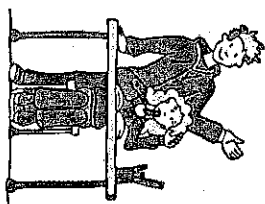

What is a Peer Tutor?

A Peer Tutor is a student who helps a classmate with a severe or moderate disability in one of their classes.

How does Peer Tutoring help students with disabilities?

- Peer Tutors give an example of good behavior
- Peer Tutors ask for help when their classmate may not be able
- Peer Tutors encourage better study habits
- Peer Tutors give students with disabilities a chance to practice social skills such as taking turns or having a conversation
- Students with disabilities get more one-on-one attention if they have a Peer Tutor working with them

How does Peer Tutoring help the Peer Tutor?

- Peer Tutors develop important skills such as problem solving, patience, and listening and communication skills
- Peer Tutors learn to be more sensitive to classmates
- Peer Tutors make a difference in someone's life
- Peer Tutors make friends!
- Peer Tutors become more confident in themselves
