London and Cheltenham. As part of the application process, you'll need to select which organisation you're applying for. Both are London-based, but the MI5 role will be based in Cheltenham for up to the first 2 years.

Flexible working: 36 hours a week full time (MI5), 37 hours a week full time (MI6). Office-based, with no remote or flexible working available during the training period. After this, flexible working may be possible, subject to business need.

Please note that you'll need to apply for the programme with either MI5 or MI6, depending on which organisation you wish to join. You may not apply for both. The MI5 role is based in London and although the MI6 role is a London role, you will be based in Cheltenham for the first two years.

Candidates must normally have been resident in the UK for seven out of the last ten years. This is particularly important if you were born outside the UK. 
