What is the definition of Bullying?

Tennessee Code Annotated is a collection of the State of Tennessee's laws that school system follows. They provide School Systems with the following definition of Bullying (TCA 49-6-4503(b)(2), (13)) :

“Bullying/Intimidation/Harassment” is an act that substantially interferes with a student’s educational benefits, opportunities, or performance, and the act has the effect of:

1. Physically harming a student or damaging a student’s property;
2. Knowingly placing a student in reasonable fear of physical harm to the student or damage to the student’s property;
3. Causing emotional distress to a student; or
4. Creating a hostile educational environment.

Bullying, intimidation, or harassment may also be unwelcome conduct based on a protected class (race, nationality, origin, color, sex, age, disability, religion) that is severe, pervasive, or persistent and creates a hostile environment.

The school board policy 6.304 “Student Discrimination, Harassment, Bullying, Cyber-bullying and Intimidation” can be found on our district website under board policies.
