## Advisement Lesson

Teachers: Please use the information below to guide your students on viewing course descriptions, reviewing electives, and making electives requests.

- 1. Review this Course Selection Guide carefully with students.
- Students should visit the <u>MVHS Curriculum Website</u> at (<u>https://sites.google.com/g.gcpsk12.org/mvhscurriculum</u>) for information about course descriptions and the course expectations and any prerequisites.
- 3. Pass out the <u>Course Planning Sheet</u> (yellow paper) and <u>MVHS Elective Options at a</u> <u>Glance for the 2025-26 School Year</u> (white paper).
  - Remind students to use this sheet as a reference in the conversations with your current teachers (core and elective) AND during the fair.
  - If you need additional copies, please email 514 Scheduling Team.
- 4. Please share with students that they will need <u>four (4)</u> CORE COURSES (typically) and two <u>(2) ELECTIVE COURSES</u>; an additional two elective course choices will be requested as alternates.
- Share with students that they will be attending the Course Exploration Fair on January 17 during their advisement.
- CORE COURSE TEACHERS (Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies) recommendations are completed by your current teacher - have the conversation with students about next year's placement.
- 7. ELECTIVE COURSE TEACHERS (outside the core requirements) recommendations are completed by your current teacher have the conversation with students about next year's placement. Like the core teachers, you may recommend placement in the next level course.
- 8. EACH STUDENT MUST COMPLETE <u>THE MVHS SY 2025-26 Electives Selection</u> Form
  - Students will select four (4) ELECTIVE CHOICES: 2 firm choices and 2 alternates
  - Remind students to refer to the <u>LIST OF ELECTIVE COURSES</u>
  - IMPORTANT: please share with students that if they wish to take a course at a level above what is recommended by the core content teacher, they will need to complete the <u>Course Override form</u> and return by February 28th to the Office of Student Support.



#### THINGS TO KNOW:

- Know what ELECTIVE COURSES you want to select and complete the Google Form before the window closes on Jan. 30
- All students must complete the course selections with their teachers AND the electives selection Google form even if you plan to pursue Dual Enrollment, Maxwell/Grayson Tech.
- Select SIX total classes (S1/S2) selected these are the classes you WANT
  - FOUR CORE classes (Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies) + TWO ELECTIVE classes
  - Select TWO ALTERNATE ELECTIVE CLASSES: (these are your backup electives)
  - Why do you need alternates?
    - Alternates are used if/when we are not able to give you an elective class you selected.
- Talk with your teachers! Course requests are made based on the TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS with STUDENT INPUT for electives.

#### THINGS TO KNOW:

#### What happens during the Counselor Individual Scheduling Meetings?

- This an opportunity for students to verify your course requests to reflect 4 core classes (Math, Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science), 2 elective classes, and the alternate electives.
  - This list of classes does not mean the students are scheduled for the classes.
  - If the course requests are CORRECT, the student verifies this information with the counselor.
  - If the course requests are INCORRECT, the student discusses options with the counselor.

#### What is the DROP/ADD process?

- At an announced time in April, students will view the tentative 2025-26 course requests in StudentVue
- Attempts to resolve scheduling conflicts will be made as issues arise.
  - IF the Course Requests document is CORRECT, then a student does not have to do anything.
  - IF the Course Request document is NOT correct or a student needs to make a CHANGE, then the student will complete a Drop/Add Request.
    - This will be a link available through the Mountain View website and open for a specific time period.
    - A drop/add request can be completed for any student who wants: A different level class/different course than what the teacher recommended (or what they selected in February)
