Seniors are National Merit semifinalists

Among the nation's highest scorers on the 2023 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, semifinalists represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors.

More than 15,000 semifinalists are expected to advance to the finalist level and will be notified of this designation in February. The winners will then be selected from that group as they compete for one of three types of scholarships worth nearly \$26 million - National Merit \$2,500 scholarships, corporate-sponsored scholarships and college-sponsored scholarships

As with the National Merit Scholarship Program, these three programs use the junior year PSAT/NMSQT as the qualifying test. There are no financial awards attached to these three awards.

"Our students are known to be highachievers, and we are proud to have so
many seniors once again named as National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists
and Commended students," said Tenafly
High School principal Jim Morrison. "We
also appreciate the additional recognitions for our Hispanic, African American
and first generation students. As a school

The number of National Merit Scholarship Program semifinalists in a state is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors. To become a finalist, the semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application, in which they provide information about the semifinalist's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. A semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high

school official, write an essay, and earn SAT or ACT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test.
