
Hello Netherwood Knoll Families,

Head Lice Information

Around this time of year we receive questions about head lice. In accordance with the most recent heath guidance from the <u>American</u> <u>Academy of Pediatrics</u>, the <u>OSD Head Lice Policy</u>, does not require students with head lice to stay home from school because lice is neither a health hazard nor sign of poor hygiene. NKE Rotations Updates


Art

- At the end of January and into February students will be starting the Ceramics unit.
 - 4th will be using slab, coil, scratch/attach methods to build a vessel.
 - 3rd will be using slab, scratch/attach methods to create a tile.
 - 2nd will use the coil method to create a heart.
 - 1st will use the pinch pot, scratch/attach methods to create a mouse.
 - Kinder will use texture to create a pendant and a pinch pot.



Physical Education

 End of January and beginning of February we will be participating in Gymnastics and Tumbling!



- All grades will be focusing on safety, balances, rolls 3rd and 4th graders will perform gymnastics routines for their class 1st and 2nd graders will be learning what a routine is and stringing moves together The big focus for gymnastics is Safety! We will focus on keeping our head/neck safe

NKE Rotations Updates

Library/Technology

4th Grade: Fourth graders have been learning about how to cite their sources; there are a lot of details to include when sharing where you found your facts. In February, we will learn about the difference between primary and secondary sources and practice using Google Docs.

3rd Grade: Third graders have been comparing and contrasting sources of information, and continuing to practice typing skills. In February, they will learn how to design and create using 3D pens, and learn about the ALA children's book awards.

2nd Grade: In February, second graders will learn about algorithms and coding using Dash Robots. We will review how to use PebbleGo for research and discover more book series in the Fiction Favorites section.

1st Grade: First graders will take a closer look at Stacy McAnulty's nonfiction books. They are learning about algorithms and coding, and learning how to control Ozobot robots.

Kindergarten: Kindergartners have explored computer language on Kodable and learned habits readers use to choose new books. In February, they will learn more about staying safe online and take a closer look at nonfiction text features.
