AP Honor Roll

Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School is the only school in Kankakee County that has received an AP Honor Roll designation. We are also in the top 20% in the state. We earned the AP Honor Roll Bronze designation and the Access Award by meeting the threshold in all three categories: College Culture, College Credit, and College Optimization. Here is more information on the three different categories:

<u>College Culture</u>: greater than 40 percent of students in the graduating class who took an AP exam at any point in high school, regardless of score. To avoid pressure on students to take large numbers of APs, only 1 AP exam per student.

<u>College Credit</u>: greater than 25 percent of students in the graduating class who took an AP exam at any point in high school, regardless of score. To avoid pressure on students to take large numbers of APs, only 1 AP exam per student contributes to this indicator.

<u>College Optimization</u>: greater than 2 percent of students in the graduating class who took 5 or more AP exams in high school, where at least 1 exam was taken in 9th or 10th grade. Because research finds that 6 or more APs do not improve college graduation rates beyond the optimal total of 5 such courses in high school, no exams beyond 5 per student contribute to this indicator. The Honor Roll also recognizes schools that encourage students earlier on their AP journeys so as not to overload them with AP courses their junior and senior years.

To qualify for the AP School Honor Roll, schools must meet or exceed the criteria for a given recognition level for all three metrics. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose Advanced Placement (AP) programs are delivering results for students while broadening access to advanced coursework. Illinois Report Card


Our district takes pride in its long-term financial stability. BBCHS District 307 has achieved the highest financial management assessment rating of any school district in the state of Illinois. We are consistently below the state average in instructional expenditures per student and operational expenses per student.

Financial Status: Recognition - 4.0 If a district receives a score of 3.54 - 4.00, they are in the highest category of financial strength - Financial Recognition.

Instructional spending per student includes only the activities directly dealing with the teaching of students. Operational spending per student includes nearly all costs for overall operations in the school district, including instructional spending. BBCHS has a trend of being well below the state average in both, reflecting responsible financial management. According to the Illinois Report Card, this past school year, BBCHS's operational spending was \$16,000 per student, and the state average of operational spending per student is \$18,905.

This is an amazing accomplishment, and we are so grateful that Explore Act Tell recognized their hard work. Great job!




Football Hosts 2nd and 3rd Round of Playoffs

All-Conference Swimmers








Upcoming Dates


COMMUNITY EVENT: LEGENDARY HALL OF FAME NCAA (SEC) BASEBALL COACH
