Advanced Placement (AP) Scholars Announced for 2024

Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School is proud to announce the 2024 class of Advanced Placement (AP) Scholars. This year, a total of 73 students were recognized for their exceptional performance on AP exams. Since 2021, BBCHS has grown in students receiving this recognition from 31 in 2021 to 73 in 2024.




Of the 73 students, 50 were named AP Scholars, 12 were named AP Scholars with Honor, and 11 were named AP Scholars with Distinction. AP Scholars are students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams. AP Scholars with Honor are students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken, and AP Scholars with Distinction are students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken.

BBCHS congratulates all of the 2024 AP Scholars and recognizes their impressive accomplishments. We also congratulate the teachers who worked hard to provide them learning experiences that helped them achieve these accomplishments.

Perfect Scores for Hayden Berens!

We want to give a huge congratulations to Hayden Berens, who is an AP Scholar with Distinction. She took 8 AP Exams, and scored a 5 on all of them. This means that Hayden got PERFECT scores

Athletic Hall of Fame Dinner

Three BBCHS alumni were inducted to our Athletic Hall of Fame this October. We celebrated Jerrod Gray (2007), Adam Vogel (2001), and Sue Schierenbeck (1980) for their careers as Boilermakers. The Athletic Hall of Fame Dinner was held to honor them and all of their accomplishments. They were also announced at the home football game on October 11th.

Sue Schierenbeck was a standout three-sport athlete playing volleyball, basketball, and track and field. She earned 12 varsity letters in her four years at BBCHS competing on the varsity level in all three sports as a freshman. Sue is the only female to qualify for an IHSA state tournament series in both an individual and a team sport with a total of 5 state appearances.

Adam Vogel contributed to the athletic success of BBCHS as a football coach and head strength coach from 2011-2022. He was an all-state football player and a wrestling state qualifier with a record of 38-1 his senior year. Adam attended Indiana State University on a full scholarship to play football where he was a 4-year varsity letterman earning Academic All-Conference two of his four seasons. He went on to play 5 seasons professionally.

Jerrod Gray was a standout athlete in football and track. He was a state qualifier in the shot and disc for track, and he was a two-time team MVP in 2006 and 2007. In football, Jerrod was an all-state player who earned a full-ride football scholarship to Ball State University where he competed in the International Bowl in 2007 and the GMAC Bowl in 2008.



Marching Band Holds First Concert

On October 15th, the marching band held their first concert of the school year in the auditorium at BBCHS. They have been practicing frequently, as they have been performing at our home football games as well. Great job, marching band!

Flag Football is State Bound for the First Time!

Our semifinal matchup was against Fremd, which unfortunately ended in a loss for the Boilers. However, Fremd would soon be named the Illinois Flag Football State Champions. We then lost our third place game to Whitney Young, therefore, we finished 4th in our very first season as a program. We held a state trophy presentation for the community to see the hardware we were able to bring home! There is a lot to be proud of. Great job, girls flag football and coaching staff!

Bradley-Bourbonnais District 307 Bond Referendum

On Tuesday, November 5th, residents of Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School District 307 will vote on a proposed bond referendum. If approved by voters, the proposed referendum would address essential safety and security upgrades and other identified critical needs to provide an improve learning environment for students.

Our bond referendum will:

- Improve safety and security
- Eliminate portable classroom trailers
- Add new cafeteria spaces to condense six lunch periods
- Relocate and improve the library
- Add 15 classrooms
- Centralize physical education spaces and pool observation by adding a fieldhouse
- Renovate gyms to create STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) rooms and science labs
- Add nurse's spaces
