In his State of the State address last week, Governor Greg Abbott outlined his top priorities for the 88th Texas Legislature and designated seven emergency items for lawmakers:

- Cutting property taxes
- · Investment in the state's water infrastructure
- Increase teacher pay
- Strengthening career training programs for students post-high school
- Using public dollars for private education purposes (school choice, education savings accounts)
- Stiffen the state's bail laws

This recognition highlights Belton ISD as a leader in CTE excellence across Texas.




Belton High School's Tiger Smokehouse Teams Sizzle to State
