NO TAX RATE INCREASE BOND ISSUE

Maintaining excellence in Lee's Summit R-7 Schools

Lee's Summit R-7 School District voters will consider a \$225 million no tax rate increase bond issue on the April 8, 2025 ballot.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

The 2025 bond issue projects, informed by five key priorities championed by our community, would:

Update schools to meet modern standards for accessibility, safety and future-ready learning.

Prepare the district to address future growth and accommodate the needs of all students.

Protect taxpayer investments by prioritizing essential upgrades and deferred maintenance districtwide.

BALLOT LANGUAGE

Shall Reorganized School District No. 7 of Jackson County, Missouri (Lee's Summit R-7) issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$225,000,000, estimated to result in no increase to the District's debt service property tax levy, for the purpose of acquiring, improving, repairing, constructing, renovating, furnishing and equipping new and existing school sites and facilities and the purchase of land? If this question is approved, the District's debt service property tax levy is estimated to remain unchanged at \$0.87 per \$100 of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

GREENWOOD ELEMENTARY (1910)

A new school on a new site maintains Greenwood's character and historical charm through cohesive design that supports safety, accessibility, and inclusion.

HAZEL GROVE ELEMENTARY (1940)

A new school at a new site includes exceptional, accessible, and safe learning spaces that support a welcoming culture.

PLEASANT LEA MIDDLE SCHOOL (1969)

A sixth grade "pod" addition aligns building design with the standards of our newest middle schools; program facility/infrastructure upgrades support dedicated grade-level spaces; improved traffic loops & access points enhance campus navigation.

MILLER PARK CENTER (1923)

A new secure and accessible entryway on the south side of the building enhances connectivity and supports safety for a school serving highneed students; parking lot and traffic loop updates improve accessibility and navigation.

ADDITIONAL ELEMENTARIES

A Board-approved resolution holds bond dollars for additional elementary improvements pending the outcome of specific engagement regarding the future of Lee's Summit/Westview Elementaries.

HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL & SOFTBALL FIELDS (LSN, LSW)

Updated baseball/softball fields (turf & fencing) at Lee's Summit North and West brings high schools to a similar standard as the Lee's Summit High School fields at East Trails Middle School.

HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER & BAND FIELDS (LSHS, LSN, LSW)

An additional multi-use turf field at each high school benefits programs such as soccer and band by providing a practice and performance space that is safe, durable, and more weather-resistant.

AEROSPACE CLASSROOM

An Aerospace Academy classroom at Lee's Summit Municipal Airport Hangar 2, part of a partnership between LSR7 and the City of Lee's Summit.

DISTRICTWIDE MAINTENANCE, EQUIPMENT, SAFETY/SECURITY

- Site (Asphalt, concrete, playgrounds etc.)
- Interior (Flooring, casework, security)
- Exterior (Doors, windows, roof, masonry)
- Mechanical/Plumbing (HVAC, heaters)
- Electrical (Fire alarms, lighting, intercom)
- Safety & Security
- Accessibility Audit Upgrades
- Instructional/Operational Equipment
- Classroom Furniture
- Land

Note: These plans would combine bond revenue and general capital revenue from our 5 cent levy to address important maintenance, equipment and safety/security needs **across all district schools.**

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
