<u>Cody Castner-</u> 929 Fairview Lake Road- Expressed concerns about the importance of mental health screenings for bus drivers, referencing two significant incidents: the delayed response to 9/11 and a May 17, 2018, bus accident involving a driver with 14 prior license violations. While acknowledging the current requirements of physical health screenings and driver tests, he emphasized the equal value of mental health evaluations.

Mr. Castner posed a theoretical question to the board, mentioning this is unrelated to any specific individual or contracted service, asking if the board recognizes potential concerns about the lack of mental health testing. He found the board's reluctance to address this question concerning. To illustrate urgency, he likened the situation to standing on a train track and urged the board to consider the advice they would give under such circumstances.

President Galante reminded Mr. Castner that his concerns have been addressed and we will not speak on personnel matters.
