- I. Call to Order/Mission Statement/Pledge of Allegiance (0:15)
- II. Comments by Visitors & Delegations (1:40)
 - Lauren Snay 17 Woodwell Cir. Ms. Snay spoke as an APS employee in favor of ballot Question 1 the "Fair Share Amendment".
 - Cindy Yetman 6 Newton Rd Ms. Yetman also spoke in favor of the Fair Share amendment and asked the committee to support the resolution.
